The Regatta's Board of Directors carefully considered an array of worthy charities and has chosen the following organizations as the Official Charities for 2009:

By participating in the Charity Program, you are committing to raise at least \$1,250 per person per entry for one or more of these charities by July 1, 2009. You may raise \$1,250 per person per entry for one of the charities, or distribute the amount among each of the three charities, provided you raise a minimum of \$1,250 per person per entry. Coxswains are included in this obligation. Please specify the boat size to which you are applying and note the minimum commitment:

- 1x (\$1,250) 2x (\$2,500) 4+ (\$6,250) 8+ (\$11,250)

All funds must be raised, collected, and remitted by the participants to the Regatta by July 1, 2009.

If 2009 Entry Applications are available, this Charity Program Application Form should be accompanied by a completed Single Scull, Double Scull or Crew Entry Application Form. Accepted applicants will receive a Charity Program Entry packet by mail.

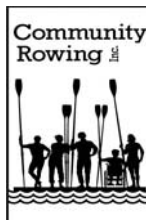
