## HISTORY OF THE REGATTA

The Head Of The Charles® Regatta, one of the world's pre-eminent rowing competitions, was first held on October 16, 1965. The race was established by Cambridge Boat Club members D'Arcy MacMahon, Howard McIntyre, and Jack Vincent, with the assistance of Harvard University sculling instructor Ernest Arlett. Arlett proposed that a "head of the river" race, similar in tradition to races held in his native England, be held on the Charles River. There were nearly 300 competitors in the first Head Of The Charles Regatta, competing in singles, fours, and eights.

Over the past 51 years, the Regatta has grown tremendously. Today, nearly 11,000 rowers (more than 2,000 boats) from 750 universities, schools, and rowing clubs representing 28 nations compete in 56 different race events. With the generous support of our sponsors—such as BNY Mellon, Brooks Brothers, and New Balance—we produce a world-class event that attracts tens of thousands of spectators.

The Head Of The Charles Regatta is managed by the members of the Cambridge Boat Club with assistance from more than 1,700 volunteers, numerous local schools and rowing clubs, and the Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR). The board of directors of the Cambridge Boat Club appoints three trustees to oversee the management of the race as well as the eleven-member Race Committee that meets year-round to oversee the operational and logistical details of the event.

In 1991, the trustees appointed Frederick V. Schoch Executive Director of the Regatta, and he continues to spearhead the event. Schoch, a former secondary school English instructor and rowing coach for many years at Princeton, the U.S. Naval Academy and Georgetown, founded the Challenge of the Hudson regatta in New York. He also has been an active member of the U.S. Rowing National Team Coaching Staff.

The Cambridge Boat Club, located at Gerry's Landing in Cambridge Mass., serves as headquarters for the event. It was established in 1909 for the purpose of encouraging boating and yachting, and as a place for social gatherings for its members. The club maintains an active membership of more than 300.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **Where does the Head Of The Charles start and finish? How long is it?**

The race starts near Boston University's DeWolf Boathouse and finishes approximately 3-miles (4,828 meters) upstream at Herter Park (aka Artesani Park) on Soldier's Field Road in Brighton.

### **What does a "Head" race mean?**

Head races are a class of regattas generally three miles long, with boats racing against the clock. Winners of each race receive the honorary title of "Head of the River" or, in this case, "Head Of The Charles."

### **How does a boat win a Head race?**

Winners are determined by time. The boat that rows the course clocked at the fastest time (including any penalties) wins its event. The quickest rowing time wins (i.e., not the first boat to cross the finish line).

### **How is each boat's time determined?**

Each boat start sequentially approximately fifteen seconds apart, and a start time is noted for each and every boat as it crosses the Start Line; the clock stops for each boat at the Finish Line. The exact time is recorded the instant each boat crosses the Start and Finish. The final Race Time is stated in minutes, seconds and thousandths of a second (ex: 18:46:228).

All boats' preliminary times are posted generally within 15 minutes after the conclusion of each event.

### **What is the best way to follow a Head race?**

Watching a head race is unique because boats start in single file, one after another, at the start line (remember, the winners are determined by time!). As boats are rowing the course, one boat can pass another boat—which means the passing boat is faster.

You can follow a particular boat's progress by noting its "bow number," which is the large number positioned on the bow (front) of every boat; basically, for each lower numbered boat it passes, a passing boat will have rowed the course faster by roughly 10-15 seconds.

Another important viewing tool is the "bow ball," also located on the bow (front) of the boat, which mimics the boat's momentum. In a nutshell, the bow ball should not bob or halt, but rather should travel smoothly. Long and fluid strokes generally make for faster boats.



**Is there a penalty system used during the race for various violations?**

Yes, and it may effect the final outcome of each event. A penalty time is added to the boat's final time, which could result in drastic changes to the boat's finish place. Examples of a reason to be penalized include failing to remain in the confines of the course, and failing to yield to boats who are attempting to pass.

**What if a boat wants to pass another boat?**

If a competitor is in a passing position, the slower boat must move or "give weigh" to the side or risk penalty. This is part of the sportsmanship of the sport.

**How can I distinguish each team or rower?**

Every boat in each race is given a number, known as a "Bow Number." The number will appear on the bow (front) of the boat. All of the bow numbers are listed in the Head Of The Charles program. Many clubs also have identifying marks on their blades (oars) or uniforms—but they may have borrowed equipment from another club. Bow numbers are the most accurate method to distinguish competitors.

**What's a "coxswain"? Do all boats have them?**

The person who steers the boat and gives commands is called a "coxswain" (pronounced COX-in) or "cox." Only the eights and fours have coxswains.

**How many boats are in this year's Regatta? People?**

This year there are 2,256 boats rowing at the 54th Head Of The Charles Regatta. In total, nearly 11,000 people will be rowing at HOOCR this year. Competition includes boats registered from 39 states and 28 countries. Over 12% of all entries are registered from countries outside of the US. The Regatta has more than 1,700 volunteers working in various capacities including race logistics and venue operations.

**Can anyone compete in the Head Of The Charles?**

Anyone can compete in HOOCR, however they must go through an entry process, and for most there is a lottery process. Approximately 33% of all entries are turned away—primarily due to space limitations of the Regatta. Rowers will get a "guaranteed" entry if they finish in the top 50% of their field in crew events and the top 25% of their field in sculling events in which they competed the preceding year.

### **Where are the best locations to watch the Regatta?**

Some of the best locations include anywhere along Memorial Drive (Route 2) in Cambridge, the start line at BU's DeWolfe Boathouse, the finish line at Herter Park, and any of the seven bridges the 3-mile course passes through. Actually, there is not a bad seat on the river.

### **What else is there to do at Head Of The Charles?**

Back for its tenth year, The Eliot Bridge Enclosure (EBE) will return to the banks of the Charles as the Regatta's premiere controlled-access hospitality experience. Situated next to the Eliot Bridge on the Boston side, this tent offers gourmet breakfast and lunch buffets from Post 390 as well as two gratis bar tickets. There is also a cash bar available. Enjoy the weekend in style at this private, comfortable venue. Tickets are \$130 per day or \$250 for the weekend.

Three other popular venues worth checking out: The **Rowing & Fitness EXPO** has the best products and services available to live a healthy lifestyle (whether you row or not!). The EXPO is located by the finish line, by Herter Park. **Attager Row**, the athlete village for 2016, is located at the Finish Area Launch Site (FALS). Attager Row houses Athlete Registration, Weigh - In, and Awards ceremonies. **Reunion Village** is a central gathering place open to the public (admission is \$10/person) for schools, clubs and groups to hang out together, while watching the Regatta at a spectacular location—on the Boston side of the Weeks Footbridge, overlooking Harvard University and the famed Weld Boathouse.

## RACE CATEGORY DEFINITIONS

### SPECIFICATIONS

**(The age of a rower in a Masters rowing event is determined as of December 31 of the current calendar year and average ages are in number of whole years lived)**

**Club:** Persons (coxswains included) not currently enrolled in high school\*, who, in any sculling or sweep-oared competition ("master/veteran" competition excepted), **DID NOT:** **A. in the current or preceding eight calendar years**, finish among the top three places at the FISA World Championships or Olympic Games; **B. in the current or preceding five calendar years**, compete at the FISA World Championships or Olympic games\*\*; **C. in the preceding five calendar years**, finish in first-place in a Championship or Lightweight event-division at the Head Of The Charles Regatta; **D. in the preceding calendar year**, earn a medal in any Championship event-division at the Head Of The Charles Regatta; or finish among the top three places in an eight at the Canadian University Rowing Championship; **E. in the current calendar year**, compete in the quarter-finals when there are at least 17 entries, semi-finals, or finals of the Henley Royal Regatta or Henley Women's Regatta; **F. in the current calendar year**, finish among the top 6 places at USRowing Elite National Championships in any event-division in which there are at least 12 entries or in the top four in any event-division in which there are at least 6 entries; **G. in the current calendar year**, finish among the **top six places** in any national team trials (juniors excepted), national or international championships (e.g., FISA World Cup, Pan-Am Games, FISA Junior Worlds, World Under 23 Regatta, World University Games, Head Of The River Race, etc.), Copley or Jessop-Whittier events at the San Diego Crew Classic, first varsity eight event at EARC Sprints, EAWRC Sprints, South/Central Sprints, NCAA (Division I events only), PAC-10, IRA; **H. in the current calendar year** finish among the top three places in the women's first varsity eight event (lightweight or open weight) at the Pac-12, Ivy League, Atlantic Coast (ACC), or Women's Sprints.; **I. in the current calendar year**, finish among the top three places in a 2000 meter event at the Royal Canadian Henley Regatta (junior events excepted); **J. in the current calendar year**, finish in first-place in a varsity eight event (lightweight or open weight) at the Dad Vail Regatta, the ECAC National Invitational Collegiate Championships, the American Collegiate Rowing Championships or NCAA Finals (all divisions).

*NB: The Regatta reserves the right to rule on any competition situation not specifically addressed above and to grant exceptions on the rules above based on competitive standards.*

*\* As of 2013, athletes enrolled in high school are no longer permitted to enter the Club Singles event; high school scullers must row in the Youth Singles event.*

*\*\* Any athlete competing as a Senior or U23 national team member under the name of their nation's governing body in national or international competition in the current calendar year is ineligible for the Club event-division.*

**Men's Collegiate\* Fours and Eights:** Eligible men's rowing programs are those whose crews did not: **A.** in the current calendar year, compete in finals (grand or petite) of a first varsity eight at the EARC Sprints or IRA Championships; **B.** in the current calendar year, finish among the top six places at the PAC-12 Championships; **C.** in the preceding calendar year, finish among the top six places in an eight at the Canadian University Rowing Championships.

**Women's Collegiate\* Fours and Eights:** Restricted to crews whose rowing programs are considered Division II or III status under NCAA rules or non-varsity rowing programs whose crews did not: **A.** in the current calendar year, compete in the finals (grand or petite) of a first varsity eight at the EAWRC or South/Central Sprints; or **B.** in the preceding calendar year, finish among the top three places in an eight at the Canadian University Championships.

*\*Bona fide students enrolled at and representing accredited/chartered colleges and universities and eligible to compete in intercollegiate athletics are eligible for the Collegiate event-divisions. Applicants outside of North America must contact HOCR*

## SPECIFICATIONS (CONTINUED)

*Before applying for Collegiate events in order to assess that they are properly placed in this event. The HOCR will make final eligibility determinations for all crews.*

NB: In the interest of fair competition, the Regatta reserves the right to rule on a crew's eligibility and appropriate placement in any Collegiate event-division.

**Alumni Eights:** Persons who attended the same academic institution (named at the time of entry application) who are not currently enrolled at the academic institution in question.

**Youth Singles/Doubles:** Persons enrolled in high school.

**Youth Fours/Quads/Eights:** Persons (coxswains included) enrolled in high school.

**Master Singles:** At least 30 years old.

**Master Doubles/Fours/Eights:** Rowers' ages average at least 40 years, none except coxswains under 30 years old.

**Senior-Master Singles:** At least 40 years old.

**Senior-Master Doubles/Fours/Eights:** Rowers' ages average at least 50 years, none except coxswain under 30 years old.

**Grand-Master Singles:** At least 50 years old.

**Grand-Master Doubles/Fours/Eights:** (Special Medal within Senior-Master events) Rowers' ages average at least 60 years, none except coxswains under 30 years old.

**Veteran Singles I:** At least 60 years old (no handicap)

**Veteran Singles II:** At least 65 years old (no handicap)

**Veteran Doubles/Fours/Eights:** (Special Medal within Senior-Master events) Rowers' ages average at least 70 years, none except coxswain under 30 years old.

**Senior-Veteran Singles I:** At least 70 years old (no handicap)

**Senior-Veteran Singles II:** At least 75 years old (no handicap)

**Grand-Veteran Singles:** At least 80 years old (no handicap).

**Lightweight Singles:** Men: not over 160 lbs. Women: not over 130 lbs.

**Lightweight Doubles/Fours/Eights:**

**Men:** rowers' weight not over 165 lbs., no averaging.

**Women:** rowers' weights not over 133 lbs., no averaging. No person (coxswain included) enrolled in high school. (Lightweight Double is a Special Medal)

**Championship Singles:** Open (unrestricted).

**Championship Doubles/Fours/Eights:** No person (coxswain included) enrolled in high school.

**LTA Mix Fours:** Legs/Trunk/Arms Mixed Fours with coxswain. Only a rower with a minimum disability as defined in the Guidelines, such disability leading to a permanent

and verifiable activity limitation, shall be eligible to compete.

**TA Doubles:** Trunk/Arms Doubles (Mixed or Single gender). Only a rower having a minimum disability as defined in the Guidelines, such disability leading to a permanent and verifiable activity limitation, shall be eligible to compete.

**Inclusion Doubles/Four:** Crews where 50 percent of the athletes, excluding the coxswain, have a qualifying visual, physical, or intellectual impairment that substantially limits on or more major life activities and 50 percent are able bodied.

**Men's Divisions:** Male rowers and scullers only (coxswain excepted).

**Women's Divisions:** Female rowers and scullers only (coxswain excepted).

**Coxswains:** Must carry sufficient weight so as to weigh at least 100 lbs. over the entire racecourse.

**Singles/Doubles:** Traditional sculling racing shells, without coxswain.

**Fours/Eights:** Traditional sweep-oared racing-shells, with coxswain.

## GLOSSARY OF TERMS

**BLADE:** Otherwise known as "Oar," but most rowers refer to them as blades.

**BOW:** The front of the boat. Rowers are seated facing the stern of the boat.

**BOW BALL:** The white rubber ball on the front end of the boat ("shell") that protects it, and provides an easy way to see who's ahead.

**BOW NUMBER:** A numerical sign mounted on the front of each competing boat, indicating the boat's starting position in its event division.

**COXSWAIN:** He/She steers and acts like a coach by communicating position and strategy to rowers. The coxswain must weigh at least 100 pounds. Coxswains are included in three events: the youth coxed quad, the four with a coxswain and the eight.

**CREW:** The group of competitors propelling and steering a boat.

**DOUBLE:** Boats propelled by two people, each with two oars.

**EIGHTS:** Eight-oared boats with eight rowers plus a coxswain. Each rower has an oar. The boat is 58 feet long and weighs about 210 pounds.

**FOOT STRETCHER:** The place where the rower's feet are positioned. The rower's shoes are bolted into the footrests.

**FOURS:** Four-oared boats with four rowers plus a coxswain. Each rower has one oar.

**HEAD RACES:** Races taking place in the Fall season, usually at least three miles long, as physiological training for the "sprint" season in the spring. Boats compete against each other indirectly by racing against a clock. They line up in order according to numbers on their bows and start at 10-15 second intervals. Winners of each event are deemed "'Head' Of The River" (ex: "Head Of The Charles")

**PENALTY:** An addition to a boat's course time as punishment for steering or other racing rule violations.

**PORT:** The left side, when facing the bow (front) of the boat. However, rowers are seated facing the stern, so port is on their right side. The opposite side is "starboard."

**POWER 10:** A call for rowers to do 10 of their best, most powerful strokes. It's a strategy used to pull ahead of a competitor.

**QUAD:** Short for quadruple sculls. Boats propelled by four people, each using two oars (sculling). Unlike fours, quads do not use coxswains to steer the boat (except in some youth events). Instead, the person sitting in the bow (first) seat steers the boat with his/her feet while rowing backwards.

**RIGGER:** The triangular shaped metal device that is bolted onto the side of the boat and holds the oars.

**SCULLER/SCULLING:** A person or the act of a person using a pair of oars to propel the boat.

**SEAT:** Each person sitting in a boat has a seat number to locate their position within their boat. For example, an Eight will have a bow-seat, 2-seat, 3-seat, 4-seat, 5-seat, 6-seat, 7-seat, and 8-seat (aka "stroke seat").

**SLIDE:** The tracks at the bottom of each boat where the seats slide back-and-forth as the rower propels the boat with their legs.

**SINGLES:** Boats 27 feet long, 11 inches wide, and weighing some 25-30 pounds, propelled by one person with two oars, also referred to as "sculls."

**STARBOARD:** The right side, when facing the bow (front) of the boat. However, rowers are seated facing the stern, so starboard is on their left

side. The opposite side is “port.”

**STROKE RATE:** Number of strokes per minute the crew takes. Stroke ratings vary from boat to boat, depending on the number of rowers and size of athletes. At the start, the stroke rate will be higher 36 – 38 strokes per minutes for an Eight, then settle at the middle of the race to 32 – 36 strokes per minute. Singles (scullers) will start at 32 – 34 strokes per minute, then settle to 28 – 32. Most rowers will attempt to sprint the final 500 meters of the race.

**STROKE:** The person who is closest to the stern and sets the rhythm for the boat; others behind him/her must follow his/her cadence.

**SWEEPS:** Each person using a single oar to propel the boat, most often in Fours or Eights.

## READING RACE RESULTS

For each event in the Head Of The Charles, there will be two sets of results distributed. The first set, marked “Unofficial,” is the actual time that each boat completed the course. Using a 15-station adjudication system, judges then assess penalties to racers in violation of course rules. Once these penalties are assessed, a second set of results, marked “Official,” will be distributed.

Below is a sample of how the results may appear on the result sheet. Penalties are noted on the right and include the penalty code with the corresponding time addition.

# 2018 RACE PREVIEWS

## SATURDAY RACES – OCTOBER 20, 2018

### 1. Men's Senior Veteran Singles I and II

Come one, come all. The 2018 HOCR kicks off with the Men's Senior Veteran Singles I and II, with several Grand Veteran competitors in the field. These three divisions break-down to the 70 - 74 group, 75 - 79, and 80+, respectively. Tom Bishop, last year's champion is back at bow 1, to defend his title. Michael Tebay is back once again to give Bishop a run for his money, starting just behind Bishop at bow 2. The former GB National Team athlete set a commanding pace in 2016 despite starting bow 37. Chuck Cook returns this year looking to reclaim one of the top spots.

In the Senior Veteran II category (75 - 79), a familiar face, Henry Hamilton is back at bow 10 looking to defend his reign as top SV II. He'll need to hold off Landon Carter, who recently moved into the SV II category, having finished 8th in the SV I last year. Carter will be holding bow 7 this year looking for his first win since 2013.

Carlo Zezza leads the Grand Veteran group at bow 11 hoping to add a third GV victory to his list of accolades. In addition to former course record holder, Chris Collins at bow 17, the GV category is ripe with new competition - will there be some shake ups in our GV top spots?

### 2. Women's Veteran/Senior Veteran Singles I and II

Following the same organization as the Men's Senior Veteran I/II event but combining the Veterans I/II, Senior Veterans I/II and Grand Veterans, 48 women from ages to 60-80+ compete in this event. Margarita Zezza is back to defend her title as Veteran I champion. Diane Davis, Veteran I 2016 champion (60 - 64), starting at bow 2 will be looking to reclaim the top spot from Zezza. This category is full of seasoned racers all looking to break into the podium spots. 2013 Veteran I champion, Catherine Widgery moves into the Veteran II (65 - 69) category; after finishing fourth overall last year, she will be looking for her first Veteran II win in the new age class.

The Senior Veteran I division sees the return of 2017 champion Catherine Kemper. Keep an eye out for Jill Gardner who moves into the Senior Veteran II division returning after a one-year hiatus. With a clean course, she and Kemper could put on a real show.

Janice Stone once again returns, leading the Senior Veteran II category at bow 8. She will be hoping to extend her divisional winning streak for a fourth straight year.

### 3. Veteran Men's Singles I and II (60+)

The Veteran I division could turn into a hot race for the podium. John Randle is back to defend last year's win. We can expect that Bob Eldridge and Tim Willsallen have no intentions of making this an easy repeat win for Randle. Eldridge finished second in this division in 2017, with Willsallen just behind him in third. The two

finished with just four seconds between them last year.

The Veteran II division could be a Saturday race to watch with returning heavy hitters Ian Luxford at bow 2, Richard Anderson at bow 5, and Volker Nolte at bow 9. Luxford won the division last year, finishing second overall. Keep an eye out for Gregg Stone, local favorite, who starts at bow 50. Returning from injury this year, and breaking into the Veteran II division, Stone will be looking to reclaim his spot on the podium.

#### **4. Grand Master Men's Singles (50+)**

The last time someone other than Greg Benning won the Grand Master Single, was before Benning was old enough to race this category. Will this be the year? Benning will once again lead the pack with bow 1; no doubt Russell Cone, James McGaffigan, and Tom Bohrer (bows 2 through 4) have their sights set on being the first to unseat the reigning victor. McGaffigan was hot off the line in 2017 and ahead of Benning at both RBC and Weld. If he can hold on during the back half of the course, we could see the upset we've been waiting for. With 60 entries spanning 16 states, and seven countries anything could happen. Or Benning could just win. Again.

#### **5. Grand Master Women's Singles (50+)**

For the last several years, our top three scullers in this event have been taking turns at the top spot. In 2017, Charlotte Hollings (bow 1) finally claimed the first place spot after years of battling Mitz Carr (bow 2) and Maureen Harriman (bow 3). This race may well be the one to watch with all three of these women finishing less than four seconds from each other last year. Each of these scullers has had a taste of victory and it is unlikely any of them will be willing to give it up without a fight. For a chase at the back of the pack, keep an eye on Saiya Remmler (bow 33), five-time winner of the Master Doubles.

#### **6. Senior-Master Men's Eights**

Who do we have here? Let's break it down. The Senior-Master division comprises three potential medal categories: Senior-Master (50+), Grand-Master (60+), and Veteran (70+). The age requirements apply to the average, not the individual so you'll see a handful of young bucks (30+) rounding out these line-ups. The battle between Marin and Molesey continues. Last year, Marin took the top spot (and course record) from Molesey, earning themselves Bow 1. No doubt they want to reclaim the title this year, chasing Marin down from Bow 2. Coming back with a nearly brand new line-up boasting enough World Rowing bios that it's not worth googling past five-seat, we'll see if Molesey found the speed they're looking for. The top seed for the Grand Master division, Melbourne University Boat Club made their debut last year, coming from deep in the pack to claim the Grand Master title. They'll be looking to hold off local crew, Team Attager. With five entries in the Veteran division, this race has more than doubled in size from last year. Reigning Veteran champs, Occoquan International, will be looking to add a 9th consecutive victory to their run. Will this year be the year they are unseated?

#### **7. Senior-Master Women's Eights**

Last year's winner, Chinook Performance Racing returns at Bow 1 thanks to their

record setting performance last year. With two entries from Chinook in this division, they're fielding their Grand Master crew in the first seed. BMA Boat Club will start at Bow 2 as the top seed in the Senior Master division, with last year's second place finisher Lake Union at Bow 3. Keep an eye out for Masters Coaching (Bow 4) and College Club of Seattle (Bow 5), both finished in the top 4 last year, and will be looking to improve on their performances. Regulars and longtime rivals in this event Etats Unis and 1980 Rowing Club are making appearances again in the Grand Master division, both crews boast past Olympic athletes, and will be looking to challenge Chinook for the GM title. Two crews will be vying for the Veteran Special Medal this year – Masters Coaching and Avalon Rowing Club.

### **8. Senior-Master Men's Fours**

With last year's winner, Wallingford, opting out, Marin leads the pack at bow 1. Ann Arbor and Cornell University Alumni challenge them from Bow 2 and 3, respectively. The top seed in the Grand Master division, Leander Boat Club, is at bow 8; followed by Rocky Mountain Club, and two boats from Cambridge Boat Club. These four boats finished with less than five seconds separating them last year. Three boats contend for the Veteran special medal; returning Veteran Champs Kent Mitchell Rowing Club, Fairmount Rowing Association, and a new addition to the Veteran division this year, Octos.

### **9. Senior-Master Women's Fours**

Cambridge Boat Club leads the field this year with bow 1, thanks to their middle-of-the-pack-to-victorious performance last year. Bow 2, Berkeley, also surprised last year, finishing second after having started second to last. We'll see how these boats perform when they are being chased, rather than chasing. Chinook Performance Racing will start at bow 10 as the first in the Grand Master division. Chinook has a third entry in this event, representing the first seed of the Veteran's division. They'll be challenged by Vesper Boat Club, and Avalon Rowing Club for the Veteran Special Medal.

### **10. Men's Master Doubles**

The top three doubles from 2017 are all returning with identical line-ups. At bow 1, RBC local boys Sean Wolf and Pete Morelli will be vying for their fourth consecutive win in this event, and are still in search of that elusive course record. Will this be the year? They'll be chased by the UBC entry of Ned Flint and Edward Demetriou at bow 2. Patrick Johnson and James Dundon return at bow 3. For a surprise, keep an eye on the twins at the back of the pack, Geoff and Greg Klingsporn at bow 11.

### **11. Senior-Master Men's Doubles**

Michael Smith and Dan Gorriaran may well be the winningest double in HOCR history, with thirteen championships since 2003. They return at bow 1 after a 20+ second victory over the CBC duo of James Pierce and Jay Mason (bow 2), and the Chinook double of Macauley Nash and Robert Reichart at bow 3. The Toronto Sculling Club entry of Velte Vinje and Philip Monckton kicks off the GM field at bow 4 looking for their second win in this division. Watch for a great mid-field race between the two leading Veteran entries, Berkeley Paddling and Rowing Club at

bow 15, and Pettipaug YC Rowing at bow 16.

### 12. Women's Master Doubles

With Hilary Gehman swapping doubles partners, she loses bow 1 to Riverside's Tina Vandersteel and Alexis Belakovskiy. They'll be chased by 2016 winners of this division, Ashley Lanfer and Sarah White at bow 2; and two Cambridge Boat Club entries made up of Molly Scannell and Jennifer Sacchetti (bow 3), and Christine Collins and Bethany Grant (bow 4). Hilary Gehman teams up with former Canadian National Team athlete Gen Meredith at bow 9. Lindsay Meyer could shake things up from bow 7 as she enters this division for the first time with Ellen St. Clair.

### 13. Senior Master Women's Doubles

The CBC double of Matthes/Mazzio hold their spot at the top of the pack after last year's victory. This dynamic duo not only have a deep familiarity with the course, but also have years of experience rowing together. We will see how these assets stack up against Krichko/Devitt and Stekl/Tuite. Krichko and Devitt are starting at bow 2, representing the top seed for the Grand Master division. Also in the Grand Master division, is last year's GM winners from Rivanna, Anne Cann and Catherine Coffman. They will be starting at bow 6. Our Veteran Special Medal competitors this year are Sara Sargent and Barbara Hogan from Fairmount Rowing Association; keep an eye out for them at bow 10.

### 14. Men's Master Singles

Andrew Hashway returns at bow 1 looking for his fourth straight win in the Men's Master Single. Could we see the makings of a friendly Charles River rivalry between Hashway and neighboring sculler Dave Ringham? Ringham will be rowing bow 2 hoping to claim his first victory in this category, after having finished in the top 4 the last three years. Andrew Neils, Mike Farry, and Nate Kelly round out the top five spots, from bows 3, 4, and 5, respectively. Jake Georgeson and Drew Tenant could challenge from bows 12, and 14. Keep a look out for German brothers Fabian and Gero Mimberg, rowing under bows 6 and 7 respectively. As a special shout out, the Head Of The Charles' own, Brendan Mulvey will be making his first appearance in the Masters category, rowing under the Marist Alumni colors at bow 18. Trivia Question: How many former lightweight national team athletes are listed in this event-division?

### 15. Men's Senior Master Singles

Since his first appearance in this event in 2013, Hans Halvorson has made a steady climb to the top of the podium, finishing first last year. Former World Champion, Jamie Koven, will be hot on Halvorson's heels at bow 2 looking to claim his first victory. Rounding out the top five are Jake Watkins, Aleks Zosuls, and Greg Myhr. Zosuls (formerly of Union Boat Club) and Myhr representing Cambridge Boat Club, are likely hoping to use home course advantage to break into the top three.

### 16. Women's Master Singles

With last year's champion, Shannon Kaplan, moving on to the Senior Masters Singles category, this is anyone's race. Louisa Palmer's time from the 2017 Club

Single seeds her at bow 1 in a field of mostly new competitors. Returning under bow 3 is Kendell Donoho who finished third last year.

### 17. Women's Senior Master Singles

Unlike the last event, the Senior Master single is full of seasoned veterans, ready to challenge returning champion Michelle Prince. Watch for Shannon Kaplan, who's first place finish in the 2018 Women's Masters Single seeded her in the top spot in her new category. Kaplan dominated the Master Single since 2013, winning the event-division every year she entered. Returning champ, Michelle Prince will chase Kaplan at bow 2. Bryna McConarty rounds out the top three, looking to once again secure a spot on the podium.

### 18. Men's Alumni Eights

The Alumni rivalries are becoming almost as intense as these rowers' college days. BMA Boat Club (Cornell Alums) have claimed bow 1 after unseating Michigan and Northeastern, both multi-time winners in this event. It seems BMA finally fine-tuned their line up, having made a steady climb to the top over the last several years. Just behind them at bow 2 is Princeton (racing as Fat Cat), another boat that has worked its way up the results board. The Fat Cats finished second last year thanks to a 5-second penalty. Behind them, is UW Alumni, Michigan, and Northeastern rounding out the top five. The top ten of this event really adds up to a "who's-who" of the top collegiate programs.

### 19. Women's Alumnae Eights

For some, the Alumni events are the opportunity to reunite with old teammates and take a cruise down the course – for old time's sake. For others, like our top seeds, it is another opportunity to prove dominance over other fast crews. Like the Men's event, the women's Alumnae event is a rundown of the nation's fastest collegiate women. Taking the top spot this year is University of Virginia, who posted a record-setting time in last year's event. Behind them, we have Fat Cat (Princeton), BMA (Cornell), Brown, and Evergreen (Dartmouth), filling bows 2 through 5, respectively. Don't count out Michigan (bow 8) or Yale (bow 15) who have traditionally maintained a strong foothold in the top 10.

### 20. Men's Club Fours

With an interesting mix of club and collegiate crews, the Club events can lend themselves to some surprises. Riverside Boat Club leads from Bow 1 this year after taking the win last year, beating out several college boats. They will no doubt have a tough race ahead as they are followed immediately by two strong collegiate crews: Dartmouth and BU at bows 2 and 3, respectively. Rounding out the top five, we have Riverfront Recapture (bow 4) and New York Athletic Club (bow 5), who will be challenging RBC for the Club Special Medal.

### 21. Women's Club Fours

The Club events really are anyone's game. With Alabama not making the trip this year, Penn is back in bow 1. But it will not be an easy victory for them. They will have to contend with Tennessee (bow 2) who last came from bow 50 to finish third.

They also have Dartmouth who will be pushing the crowd from bow 3; they are followed by Marist (bow 4) and Duke (bow 5) to round out the top 5. Over 20 teams are vying for the Club Special Medal this year. TBC will have to work hard to hold off the likes of the Bad Unicorns and Lincoln Park, who will be pushing for that top spot.

## 22. Men's Club Eights

Yet another collegiate showdown, the Club eights are a place for the big guys to flex some muscle. It's a local crews battle at bows 1 and 2 with BU leading the pack, followed by Harvard. Riverside Boat Club is still trying to break into the top spot and be the first true club to win the event in fourteen years. They're going to have to put their best foot forward if they want to unseat BU and Harvard, who have held steady in the top five for several years. Looking to challenge RBC for the Club Special Medal are Potomac (bow 6), and German guests Ruder-Club Favorite Hammonia (bow 9). Keep an eye out for our other international crews: Peking Rowing Club (China; bow 19), Furnivall Sculling Club (GB; bow 29), Royal Navy and Royal Marines Amateur Rowing Assoc. (GB; bow 30), Bonner Ruder-Gesellschaft e. V. (Germany; bow 32), and Trinity College, Dublin (Ireland; bow 36).

## 23. Women's Club Eights

With Radcliffe's victory over Brown last year, they cinched bow 1 for this year's race. They will be followed by Yale at bow 2, who came from the back of the pack last year to finish in second place. Rounding out the top three is Penn, who have been steadily climbing to the podium in the last few years. Community Rowing is starting at bow 4 this year, leading the Club Special Medal contenders. Syracuse (bow 5), Northeastern (bow 6), and Dartmouth (bow 7) certainly won't let anyone off the throttle. These crews have had strong showings in the past years, and will no doubt be pushing hard to claim spots at the top.

## 24. Men's Master Fours [40+]

Sammamish will be looking to make this their second win in a row, starting at bow 1. Molesey at bow 2 and Palm Beach at bow 3, will be trying to make sure that doesn't happen. In the fourth starting position, is Club Nautico De San Juan, coming from Puerto Rico. Once again, the Massachusetts State Police are setting aside their boots and hats, and picking up an oar to race under bow 21.

## 25. Women's Master Fours [40+]

Marlow Rowing Club will be starting at bow 1. Not surprisingly, this crew made up of highly decorated GB rowers took the top spot last year, causing a bit of a shake up in the top five. Just behind them, was another international crew – Vancouver Rowing Club – who pushed the American crews further down the leaderboard, and secured themselves bow 2 for this year's racing. Lake Union heads up the American crews at bow 3, followed by Alexandria (bow 4) and Chinook (bow 5).

## 26. Men's Master Eights [40+]

In an upset last year, Shannon (bow 1) unseated longtime champion Molesey to take the top spot. With a line-up of five returning rowers, we will see what kind of speed Shannon can bring against a completely different Molesey (bow 2) boat.

Kennebecasis is bringing up the third spot, hoping to put themselves back in first place for the first time since 2013. Behind this international trio, the '92 Jr World Champs, who will be battling it out with Fat Cat Rowing (Princeton alums), two crews from California (a Composite and California Rowing Club), and Diesel Athletic. Give a cheer to our other international crews Cercle Nautioque Verdunios (bow 19), who joins us from France and Csepel Evezős Klub from Hungary (bow 15).

### 27. Women's Master Eights [40+]

Toronto Sculling once again returns at bow 1, hoping to add a third consecutive win to their record. With University of Queensland not returning, Pocock moves into bow 2, they will be looking to upset Toronto's winning streak. Starting at bow 3 is Capital Rowing, followed by Ottawa (bow 4), and Chinook (bow 5). For the last three years these four crews have been trading places in the top five. Keep an eye out for a potential local showdown between CRI and Riverside. They posted very close times during the Head of the Kevin series earlier this summer. It may be a fight of Charles River supremacy.

### 28. Men's Champ Doubles

In an interesting, and rare, occurrence, only one boat returns from last year's field of competitors. Irishmen Mark O'Donovan and Shane O'Driscoll of Skibbereen Rowing Club, finished seventh last year, but will take bow 1 as the sole returnees. With a brand new field, the course is wide open for new winners. Despite few returns from last year, there are a few veterans to this event who are making reappearances after taking some time off. One such crew are Craftsbury sweethearts Tom and Peter Graves; this double held down spots in the top five for three consecutive years. Where will they land this year? A couple of old dogs in Bow 6, Henry Palmer and Eliot Hovey (London 4x), will be looking to show the local crowd whether they can still run with the young pups. A handful of crews are rowing under the lightweight flag in this event, A Pop Shoppe (bow 3), Narragansett (bow 13), Undine Barge Club (bow 15 and 17), and a composite crew from Lincoln Park and Red Star (bow 18). Two teams will be vying for the College Championship special medal: Oklahoma (bow 7) and Tufts (bow 19).

### 29. Women's Champ Doubles

This event is a veritable who's-who of national teamers and Olympians, with four former Olympians and ten national team athletes (past and present) this is sure to be a great race. Last year's winners ARION return at bow 1; stroke, Maureen McAuliffe, competed in the 2018 World Championships where she finished 6th in the women's quad. Bow 2 from Riverside, comprised of Hillary Saeger and Jillian Zieff, also competed at Worlds this year. Saeger and Zieff also have highest seed in the Lightweight special medal category. It will be interesting to see if their home course advantage comes into play with such a seasoned group of rowers chasing them down. At bow 3, we have Triad United Rowing, from Italy; Bergamasco and Nencini finished third in the women's four at Worlds. Another notable entry in the Lightweight division is the Danish double from Odder Roklub. These women have both competed on the world stage, with the bow, Juliane Rasmussen, placing second in the lightweight quad. The accolades for this group could take up a whole

page – you're just going to have to watch to find out how this one shakes out.

### 30. Men's Championship Singles

With last year's winner Michael Schmid not returning for 2018, Craftsbury Sculler John Graves once again reclaims bow 1. He's long been a favorite in the event but will need to hold off a strong field of competitors this year. Bow 2, Luke Rein, set an 18 second course record in the Men's Club Single at the 2017 HOCR and has returned to run with the big boys. Starting at bow 4 and 5, respectively, are Robbie Manson and Mahe Drysdale. Manson set a World Best Time of 6:30.740 at the 2017 World Cup II in the Men's Single Sculls. Fellow Kiwi, Drysdale is renowned in the rowing world, winning two consecutive Olympic gold and 5 World Championship titles. Drysdale has taken home more than a few golds from the Charles and will be unaccustomed to starting so far back in the pack. Keep a look out for Andrew Campbell starting at bow 7. Campbell is coming off a 3rd place finish at this year's World Championships in the Men's Lightweight Single and is the record holder in this event, which he set back in 2014 and will be looking to protect.

### 31. Men's Lightweight Singles

Four-time champion in this event, Hugh McAdam is back, leading the pack from bow 1. With last year's runner up Peter Schmidt moving into the Championship single category, ARION sculler Michael Landuyt and local Riverside sculler, Sam Hausmann move into the second and third bow positions, respectively. With six countries represented, there is potential to see some speed come from some of our international dark horses. Andres Mussa (bow 4) joining us from Israel, finished in second place in the 2017 Israeli Championship in the Men's Lightweight Single. Also represented in this category are Canada, Mexico, England, and Ireland.

### 32. Women's Championship Single

This event is filled with heavy hitters. Of the 26 entrants in this event, seventeen are former or current national team members, and six have represented their countries at the Olympic Games. Dr. Gevvie Stone, the winningest sculler in the championship singles events, will be hoping to add a ninth Champ Single win to her ever-growing list of accomplishments. Felice Mueller (bow 2), Kara Kohler (bow 3), and Mary Jones (bow 4) are all coming off of A-final finishes at the 2018 World Championships, and will be looking to close the gap and possibly unseat Stone. Following them are a field of strong competitors; watch for Paralympic Silver medalist Dani Hansen making her first sculling appearance at the HOCR, and three-time Olympian (2x Gold Medalist) Caryn Davies.

### 33. Women's Lightweight Single

With last year's first and second place finishers competing in other events, Caitlin Pauls once again moves back into bow 1, and will be looking to reclaim her place top the podium. Pauls won this event two years in a row, in 2014 and 2015. Hot on her heels will be Michaela Copenhaver and Lauren Ayers, who finished 4th and 5th, respectively, behind Pauls last year. Only nine seconds separated the three places last year. Behind them is a pack of seasoned rowers, most of whom are



new to this event.

#### **34. Mixed LTA Four**

With only one entry in this event, the CRI LTA 4+ will boast a new line-up from previous years. Jenny Sichel has lead this boat down the river as their coxswain for over five years. As her home course, it is guaranteed that she knows every nuance of the river. Joining her this year are: Charles Nordin, Thomas Demers, Allie Reilly, and Molly Moore.

#### **35. Mixed Inclusion Four**

The mixed inclusion events combine athletes with a verified physical disability with able bodied athletes. This year we have four entries – three from CRI (bows 1, 2, and 4) and one from Western Reserve (bow 4).

***Sunday, October 21, 2018***

#### **36. Mixed Inclusion Double**

Since its introduction to the regatta three years ago, this event has grown leaps and bounds; the event has more than doubled, with this year's event boasting 15 entries. Last year's winners are not returning, Athletes without Limits first entry moves into bow 1. This crew finished second was less than a second separating them from the winning team – and a course record. This may be their opportunity to set a record of their own.

#### **37. Mixed TA Double - no entries**

#### **38. Men's Youth 1x**

The Youth 1x sees high turnover as athletes age up or move into larger boat classes. The 8th place finisher in this division from 2016 moves into bow 1. With only a handful of returning participants, this really could be anyone's race. Austrian junior national team athlete, Gabriel Stekl will likely show some speed from bow 14. Powerhouse Pennsylvania sculling program, Malvern Prep has three entries in this division that will all likely contend: Chenkai Mao at bow 15, John McGlenn at bow 23, and Anthony Wirtel at bow 30.

#### **39. Men's Club 1x**

With Luke Rein moving on to the Championship Single event, and the second place finisher not returning, William Weeker moves into the first bow position. Kevin Kelly will be looking to best Weeker this year, after a bouy penalty pushed him to fourth place, 1.5 seconds behind Weeker. With a clean course, Kelly could give Weeker a run for the top spot. Armando Chavez (bow 3) will be looking to break onto the podium after a steady climb toward the top over the last two years.

#### **40. Women's Youth Single**

Eliose Lambden from the American School of London kicks off this field at bow 1. She is the only returning sculler in this event and just so happens to also be the 2016 champion. She'll have Anna Matthes on her puddles at bow 2. Anna recently

finished 5th in the Women's Quad at Junior Worlds and posted the fastest women's time overall at the recent Green Mountain Head. Stotesbury Cup 1x champ, Lauren Kelly (bow 11) from St. Catharines could also work her way through the field.

#### **41. Women's Club Single**

With some turn over from 2017, last year's third place finisher, Aiste Balcuinaite, returns as bow 1 this year and will be looking to improve on her finish from last year. Balcuinaite is followed at bow 2 by Lauren Schall, who finished eighth in this event last year. At bow 4, Emily Farrar will be hoping to break into the podium positions for the first time since beginning to compete in this event in 2015. Keep an eye on our international competitors Michal Spalter (bow 5) and Holly McElhone (bow 15).

#### **42. Women's Youth Four**

In a field of 85 boats, just about anything can happen. RowAmerica Rye leads in a field of 85 boats, just about anything can happen. RowAmerica Rye leads the pack at bow 1. With so many entries each year, and turnover of nearly half (or more) of the boats year to year, there are not many repeat winners. Holy Names Academy holds the title for most repeat wins in the Women's Youth Fours, they will be starting at bow 13 this year. Many west coast crews are making a name for themselves in this event – keep an eye on San Diego (bow 2), Pacific Rowing (bow 3), Long Beach (bow 5) and Norcal Crew (bow 9).

#### **DCW4x. Directors' Challenge Women's Quad**

With the top two finishers not returning, the ladies of Lucky Charms return with bow 1. Speed and humor will be chasing them down from Bow 3 with more than a couple former national team athletes. Be sure to cheer for the mother-daughter duos in bow 22 and for crews of several long-time HOCR volunteers in bows 20, 31, and 32. The HOCR would like to thank these athletes for supporting the long-term future of the Regatta and wishes everyone good luck!

#### **43. Women's Youth Coxed Quad**

In its third year, this event continues to grow. Joining us from the north, Don Rowing (CAN) will hold bow 1 again this year, having won each year since the inception of the event. This year we have two international crews from Germany and Denmark – be sure to give them an extra loud cheer to welcome them to Boston! As the prevalence and popularity of youth sculling continues to grow, we can only expect the competition in this event to get more and more intense.

#### **44. Women's Youth Eight**

At bow 1 for the fourth consecutive year, Saugatuck will be looking to add a fifth win to their streak. In addition to their course record last year, they also set the record for most consecutive wins by a team in this event. For the last two years, fellow Connecticut crew Greenwich has been working to unseat Saugatuck. Could this be their year? Not to be counted out, we have Saratoga, Mercer, and Marin – all powerhouses on the youth circuit - rounding out the top five. With 85 entries in this event, the depth and potential for a shake-up is great. Assuming a clean course for all boats, and a decent weather day, there could be some great racing from these

crews.

### **DCMX2x. Directors' Challenge Mixed 2x**

Last year's winners, local favorites Lisa Pierce and John Randle will claim bow 1 and look to defend their title. Last year's 6th place finishers will return to claim bow 2, but this is a "for-fun" event in name only; the competition in this field will be stiff. The top seeds in this field will need to watch out for bow 30, Mads Rasmussen and his wife, Juliane, joining us from Denmark after a scratch in 2017. This power couple are both former Olympians, with Mads claiming bronze in Beijing and Gold in London. 2015 winners Margarita and Carlo Zezza will round out the field in bow 40 and will be looking to leverage their local know-how to move up the pack.

### **45. Men's Youth Doubles**

GMS leads the pack at bow 1 after setting a course record last year. Like other youth events, the reigning champion faces significant pressure from lower in the field, leading to shake ups at the top. They will have to hold off a strong pack with Ridley College at bow 2, and Seattle Rowing Center at bow 3. This is for sure an event to watch. Though we often see some excellent racing out of these youth scullers, with 44 youth doubles coming down the course at full speed, there is potential for some clashing and crashing.

### **46. Women's Youth Doubles**

There is no question of the dominance of Y Quad Cities when it comes to Women's Youth Sculling. Delaney Evans and Caroline Sharis set a course record in this event last year, granting them bow 1 for 2018. Both girls were in the quad that won Youth Nationals, as well as win (and two course records) at Henley. This is the crew to beat in this event, and likely the only boat to come close will be their own teammates – Brenna Morley and Emma Mask, who are holding bow 2. California Yacht Club will be looking to make their mark on the podium this year, having finished shy of third place last year. At the end of the day, the question remains, can anyone touch Sharis and Evans?

### **47. Men's Youth Fours**

Last year's winners (and course record setters), South Niagara are not returning this year, S.A.C. moves into the top spot at bow 1. Bow 2 are the Ohio sweethearts from Upper Arlington. This crew clinched an impressive third place finish last year after starting at bow 54. At bow 3 is Radley College; this crew has kept a steady foothold in the top 5 for the last several years. A Cinderella story if there ever was one, the Gunnery School finished 6th last year, dominating the field after starting all the way back at bow 74. This year they will start at bow 5; no doubt they will be relieved to not have to battle through the carnage that is the higher bow numbers in a youth event.

### **DCM4x. Directors' Challenge Men's 4x**

2017 Second place finishers from Texas Rowing Center return at bow 1, having captured the fastest raw time in 2017. Bow 2, last year's first place finishers, while they may not have had the fastest raw time, they certainly have the competitive drive and local know-how to drive toward the young bucks in bow 1 and capture

their 4th consecutive gold. They'll need to watch out for bow 6, which boasts the Irish 2x and bow 7, who will certainly be after bow 2 for Charles River supremacy. Bow 20, disguising its years local prowess under the aegis of Rocky Mountain Rowing Club, will be a crew to watch.

#### **48. Men's Youth Coxed Quad**

New Canaan Crew once again starts at bow 1 in this event. The sculling powerhouse has held one of the top positions since the inception of the event three years ago. At bow 2 we have Redwood Scullers who have been working their way to the top position, finishing 4th and 7th in the last two years. This year could be there year. In the top 5 we also have two Canadian crews: Argonaut Rowing Club (bow 3) and Ridley College (bow 5). Both crews have had strong showings in the last two years. Keep an eye on the three local crews – Buckingham Browne & Nichols (bow 14), Boston College High (bow 15), and CRI Row Boston (bow 26) – these coxswains have the distinct advantage of practicing daily on this course.

#### **49. Men's Youth Eights**

Last year's near-perfect conditions lent themselves to some impressively fast times in this event, including from winners St. Paul's School who set an incredible course record, shattering the previous record by over 38 seconds. In fact, the top five finishers last year all broke the previous course record. Those five crews have all returned to battle it out once again. With the typical cycles of youth rowing, it will be interesting to see which teams make their mark this year. In a field of 85, a lot can happen. We have six international boats competing in this event – four from GB, one from Germany, and one from Canada.

#### **50. Men's Championship Fours**

After a record setting year last year, USRowing will once again charge down the course at bow 1. Hot on their puddles will be University of California – Berkeley at bow 2, and Boston University at bow 3. Both boats will also be vying for the College Championship special medal. Our international teams are represented this year by the Dutch men's four – KNRB at bow 4, Rhodes University from South Africa (bow 15), and Bonner Ruder-Gesellschaft (bow 18) and Ruder-Club Favorite Hammonia (bow 8), both from Germany. Our international guests will surely be looking to stir things up with these American colleges.

#### **51. Men's Lightweight Fours**

Yale returns at bow 1 after a stellar run last year. Oxford Brookes is not returning this year, allowing Columbia to take over bow 2. Columbia's men competed at Henley Royal Regatta this summer, only to be edged out in the semifinal. Cornell will be rowing under bow 3, followed by Dartmouth (bow 4), and Penn (bow 5). Keep an eye on Ottawa (bow 6), and local crews Harvard and MIT, at bow 10 and 11 respectively. Leander Boat Club is starting in the back of the pack at bow 15 and, assuming no carnage ahead of them, they could shake things up for some of these crews.

#### **52. Women's Championship Fours**

Brown University will defend last year's victory starting the race at bow 1. Cornell

will be chasing them down the course from bow 2. This year we have a national training center back with us from Germany – DRV Potsdam will be competing at bow 3, looking to bring some pressure on the American colleges. Princeton and Syracuse round out the top 5, at bow 4 and 5 respectively. Traditionally this event has been dominated by international crews – let’s see if an American college can hold the top spot for a second consecutive year.

### **53. Women’s Lightweight Fours**

A dark horse took the win last year – Georgetown came from bow 8 (in a field of ten) to crush the field by over 30 seconds. They secured themselves bow 1 for this year. Behind them, is Stanford at bow 2 and Princeton at bow 3. These crews upset what was expected to be a local showdown last year. Not content to be beat on their home turf, BU (bow 4), Radcliffe (bow 5), and MIT (bow 6) will be looking to put home course advantage to the test and bring a victory back to the Charles River for the first time since 2015.

### **54. Men’s Championship Eights**

At bow 1 is UC Berkeley, who not only set the event’s course record, but set an all-time course record. They will have their work cut out to defend that title this year, with Yale chasing them down from bow 2. With the decision this year not to repeat the “Great 8” entries, our international competitors are competing in intact crews representing their home countries. At bow 3 and 6, we have the German National Team (DRV Dormund). We also have two USRowing crews at bow 4 and 9, sandwiching two Dutch boats from KNRB (bow 5 and 7), and the French at bow 8. There is no question that this race will provide spectacular racing. Behind our international superstars are the top collegiate teams in the country – Harvard, Northeastern, Washington... the list goes on. For an exemplar of fast rowing, this is the race to watch.

### **55. Men’s Lightweight Eights**

Last year Princeton set a blistering course record to top Cornell. It will be an Ivy League showdown at the top of this event. Princeton leads the pack at bow 1, hoping for a repeat of last year’s victory. At bow 2 is Cornell, who have been looking for their first victory in this event since 1979. To round out the top 5 are Harvard (bow 3), Yale (bow 4), and Penn (bow 5). Keep an eye on Navy (bow 7) and Delaware (bow 8) who like to come and try to shake things up.

### **56. Men’s Collegiate Eights**

After some shake ups last year, Virginia will top the pack this year at bow 1. St Joseph’s (bow 2) and Bates (bow 3) surprised some of the top ACRA schools, challenging them from further back in the top 10 to finish on the podium. Keep an eye on Trinity (bow 6) and Marietta College (bow 14) who made impressive pushes from the back of last year’s pack to move up the leaderboard. Please help us welcome two crews from China who will be competing under bow 26 and 27.

## 57. Women's Championship Eights

With no "Great 8," USRowing will be starting at bow 1 and 3. Sandwiched between them, is DRV Potsdam – the German National Team. These are our national team crews competing in a field dominated by the big names of Division I collegiate athletics. Last year's college champions Washington, are not returning, leaving the collegiate title up for grabs. Stanford (bow 4) and Yale (bow 5) will be vying for that title, and chasing down our international crews for the overall title. With the depth of this field, there is the potential for some movement in the top spots. With a clean course, and favorable weather, we could see some fast racing.

## 58. Women's Lightweight Eights

Starting at bow 1 is Stanford University who came from the back last year to set a course record and claim the title. Starting behind them is Boston University, who had an impressive year last year - during the spring, BU beat Stanford here on the Charles, then went on to win Eastern Sprints, and finish second at IRA's. This local crew has the knowledge of the river to compliment their speed, setting them up as a strong contender for a victory this year. At bow 3 is another local crew, Radcliffe, who will be looking to reclaim the victory from 2016. New to the field this year is bow 9, MSRV Saurus from the Netherlands.

## 59. Women's Collegiate Eights

This event has become a preview for the upcoming speed of the top DIII schools. Five of the top seven bows raced the Grand Finals at 2018 NCAA Championships. Bates College tops out at bow 1 this year, after an impressive and record-setting run last year. They will be chased down by Wesleyan (bow 2), Williams (bow 3) and Ithaca (bow 4), who have all historically shown impressive speed. Keep an eye on WPI at bow 7. They finished third at NCAA's this year and have been building impressive strength throughout the program.

## 60. Men's Collegiate 4+

After last year's record-setting performance, University of North Carolina – Chapel Hill will hold bow 1. Starting in bow 2 and 4 are University of Vermont and Marist College, respectively. These crews shocked the field last year, coming from the back to shake things up and finish in the top five. Be sure to keep an eye on bow 3, University of Virginia, who have won this event four times – the most of any team in this event. They will certainly be looking to reclaim the top spot for the first time

## 61. Women's Collegiate 4+

UNH has won this event 2 of the past 3 years and will start the field from Bow #1 . A crew to watch is Barry University in Bow 12 - they've won this event 3 times in the last 5 years. Bates College has a boat in this event starting Bow #29 - Bates has been a DIII powerhouse in recent years and has the depth to do well in the Collegiate 4+ in addition to the Collegiate 8+ entry.

## DCPC2x. Directors' Challenge Parent-Child Double

Martin and Andrew Holmes return in bow 1; if they win this year, they will be the winningest duo in this event, as they are currently tied with the Cataldo boys. Bows 2 and 3 return to chase the top spot, as will last year's 5th place finishers in bow 4. Keep an eye on bow 15 with former national team athlete, Esther Lofgren. Be sure to cheer for long-time HOCR Media

liaison, Chuck Fountain, in bow 20 with his daughter, Betsy.

### **DCMX8+. Directors' Challenge Mixed 8+**

The top 3 bows in this event are full of former national team athletes who certainly have not lost their taste for speed or competition. With last year's top finisher sitting out, it's any crew's race and there is certainly some speed in this event. Be sure to cheer for Bow 11, full of current and former HOCR Directors of Operations; many thanks to Brendan Mulvey and Priscilla Livingston for their tireless work to make this year's Regatta. possible!

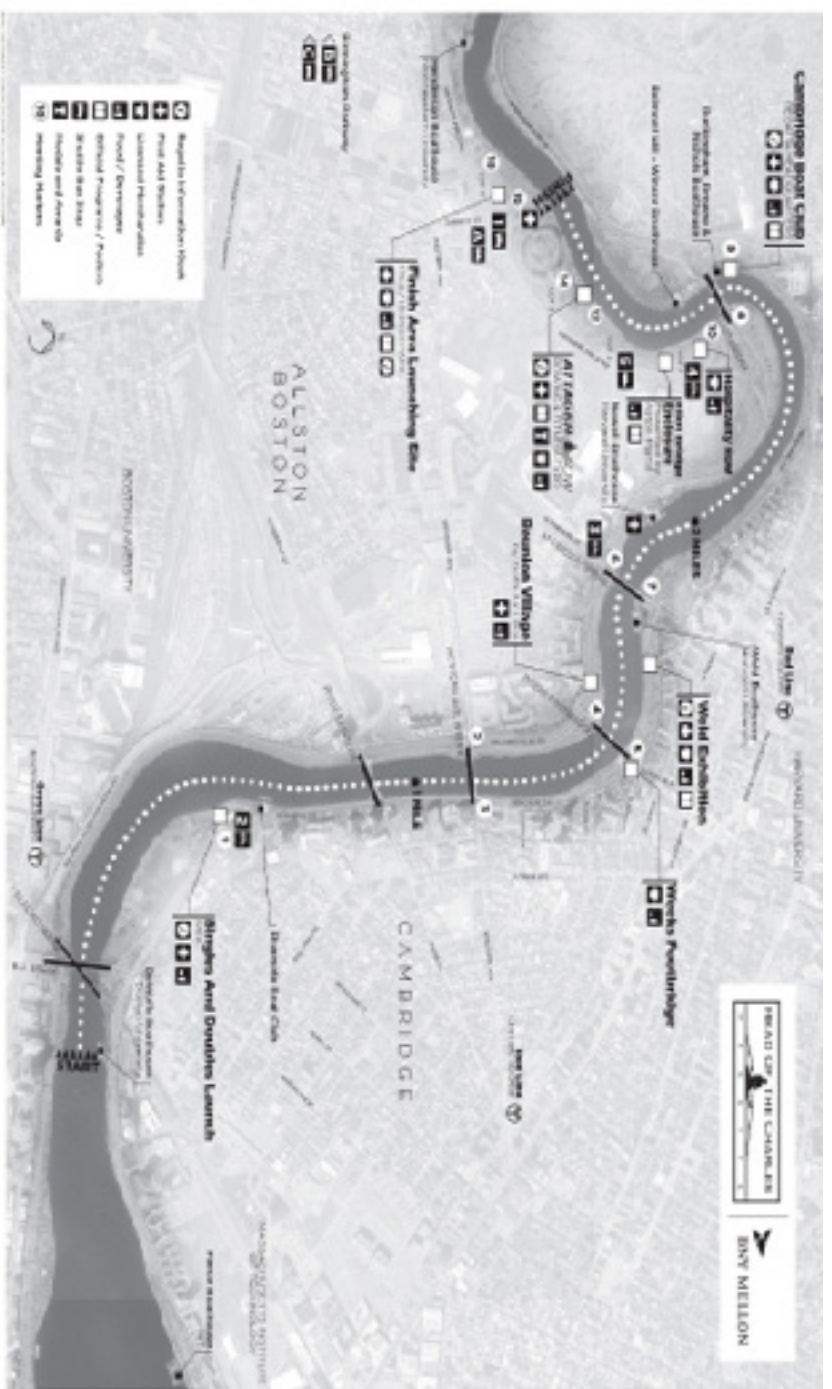
