EVENT DESCRIPTIONS

- Youth: Persons under 20 years old, including coxswains.
- Club: Limited to individuals who did not finish in the top six places in any class or event (sculling or sweep-oared), except masters or veterans, in any of the following regattas in this or the preceding calendar year: Canadian Henley, EARC, EAWRC, or Western Sprints, Headof-the-Charles, any national or international championships, IRA, PAC-10 or Dad Vail, or any national team trials.
- Master (singles): At least 30 years old.
- Master (crew): Rowers' ages average at least 40 years—no one, except cox, under 30 years old.
- Grand Master: At least 50 years old.
- Veteran: At least 50 years old, 8 second per year handicap
- Lightweight (singles): Max men: 160 lbs., Max women: 130 lbs.

The Equipment




SINGLES

Singles are boats about 26 feet long, 11 inches wide, and weighing some 30 pounds, propelled by one person with two oars sometimes called skulls.




DOUBLE SCULLS

Doubles are boats propelled by two people, each with two oars (or sculls).



FOURS

Four-oared boats have four rowers, each with one oar and a coxswain to steer and cajole them.



EIGHTS

Eight-oared boats have eight rowers, each with one oar, and they have a coxswain. The boat is about 60 feet long and weighs about 230 pounds.

- Lightweight (crew): Men—average weight not to exceed 160 lbs., no one over 170 lbs. Women—average weight not to exceed 130 lbs., no one over 138 lbs.
- . Men's Divisions: Male rowers and scullers only.
- Women's Divisions: Female rowers and scullers only.
- Championship: Open (unrestricted).
- Coxswains: May be of either sex, but must have sufficient weight with them in the boat to weigh at least 100 lbs. during entire race (no weigh in).
- Fours and Eights: Sweep-oared, with coxswain.
- Singles and Doubles: Sculling, no coxswain.
- Special Medals will be awarded to the fastest Youth sculler in each division
 of Event 1, the fastest Master crew in each division of Event 2, and the
 fastest Lightweight crew in each division of Event 13.

Dear Friends,

On behalf of the Metropolitan District Commission, it is my pleasure to welcome you to the 24th annual Head of the Charles Regatta — the largest single day rowing event in the world.

For years the Charles River and its scenic banks have provided a source of great pleasure and recreational opportunity for people who live in and visit this diverse metropolitan area. The aesthetic beauty of the Charles, with its unique basin and the Esplanade, was created by visionary architect Charles Eliot. Eliot modeled the area after a world-famous "water park" on the Alster River in Hamburg, Germany at the turn of the century. Last year the MDC took steps to meet these escalating problems. An intensive public education effort was launched with the help of the Head of the Charles Regatta Committee, colleges, universities, alumni and community groups. The number of MetroPolice was increased. Officers made a concentrated effort to enforce the ban on alcoholic beverages, open fires, camping and illegal parking.

As a result, last year's event went much more smoothly and there was a positive change in the behavior of the crowd. In light of this improvement, we are hopeful this change in behavior will continue and the pleasureable, family atmosphere along the banks will once again return.

This year the MDC will continue its crowd control and strict enforcement of rules. Once again, our clean up crews will move in at the event's completion to remove litter and restore beauty to the banks of the Charles.

We at the MDC are priviledged to be host to such an important sporting event. But we need your cooperation in maintaining this as a world-class event enjoyed by all.

In the Beginning

The Head-of-the-Charles Regatta is conducted annually on the second-to-last Sunday in October. The first race was held on October 16, 1965, and attracted nearly 100 boats and was an instant success with the public and rowers alike. The Regatta has since grown to become what is believed to be the largest single day rowing event in the world. In 1973 the founders turned the responsibility for its operation over to the Cambridge Boat Club, which placed it under the trusteeship of three Club members appointed annually by the Club's Board of Directors.

The Regatta Today

Every year our flag collection gets larger and larger. The Head-of-the-Charles attracts athletes from all over the world, in addition to its nationwide appeal in the United States. Competitors from France, England, Switzerland, Canada, Mexico, Peru, Hong Kong and East and West Germany will be rowing today. Over 3500 rowers in nearly 850 boats will row over the three mile course. Individuals, schools, colleges and clubs will compete in 16 events. The youngest rowers generally compete in high school programs, where they are introduced to the sport in fours and eights; the older rowers, who have tighter schedules, more often train and compete in the individual sculling events. This year the regatta added the Grand Masters Single event in recognition of one of the most oversubscribed age categories — 50-60 years! The pure and universal goal of every athlete in every race is to establish a personal best.

The Head-of-the-Charles is run by people who love the Charles, the sport of rowing, and its tradition. The Regatta Committee meets year-round and oversees the myriad organizational tasks and takes responsibility for the overall safety and fairness of the competition. The Regatta would like to recognize the jurisdiction that the Metropolitan District Commission exercises over the Charles River and the park land along its banks, and supports their goal of maintaining the resource and spectator welfare. The dynamic growth of the sport and popularity of the races create a need for a greater MDC presence.

The character of the regatta would be very different without the generosity of the neighboring schools, colleges, boat clubs, and their coaches and directors, who donate equipment, accommodate the flood of rowers, and maintain their good humor. The Guest Quarters Suite Hotel, our Host Hotel, offers their hospitality for registration and other functions. The omnipresence of the Red Cross emergency services generates much peace of mind. Minuteman Repeaters Association and Framingham Amateur Radio Club donate the radio network that coordinates much of the regatta. The other lifeline of the regatta is the tireless and enthusiastic corps of hundreds of volunteers who install, sell, stuff, design, mail, nail, bail, buoy, judge, announce, compute, publicize, pick-up and simply want today to be the best ever. We are eternally grateful for everyone's support and efforts.




Rowing, and How to Watch It

No doubt, all the athletes will be sitting down, facing backwards (except for coxswains), and exerting themselves strenuously. What actually happens in a rowing shell? The sculling boats, the singles and doubles, are "blind," and the scullers must look around to negotiate the course and pass others, while at the same time rowing full speed ahead. In sweep-oared boats (fours and eights) the coxswain steers and acts like a coach by communicating position and strategy to the rowers, contrary to the popular notion that they only yell, "Stroke . . . stroke . . . stroke . . . "

The competitors' objective is to get the shell over the 3-mile course as fast as possible by using their energy efficiently and completely. They do not technically pull the oar through the water, rather they plant the oar and move the shell past it. Each stroke accelerates the boat; the slowest point is when the oar is released from the water. Thus an oarsman must not only be strong during the stroke, but preserve the delicate balance to allow the boat to glide between strokes.

There are a couple of things to watch to see how well a boat is moving. First and foremost, the bow number shows where they started on the line-up, so a fast-moving boat will have gained roughly fifteen seconds for each of the lower numbers they have passed. The white rubber ball on the front end, the bow ball, mimics the momentum of the boat. Watch to see if it travels smoothly, or bobs or halts. Strong, fluid, confident stroking wins races. A tired rower may use extraneous motions by wrenching or jolting the start of the stroke. "Catching a crab" happens when a rower has their oar literally stuck in the water, and will disrupt or even cause a boat to stop altogether.




The course on the Charles is three miles long and is renown among Head races for its twisting progression and many, many bridges. Among crews it is often referred to as a "coxswain's race" because hardened nerves and a keenly negotiated course will mean precious seconds. Excitement builds as three boats approach a bridge that only two fit through. The orange buoys must not be crossed at the risk of a ten-second penalty, but a skillful crew will cut them closely as they pick the shortest distance between two points. Today's races are monitored by the most sophisticated of computerized timing systems, and finishers are often separated by only hundredths of seconds, so every stroke counts!

"Head" Regattas

Since "Head of the Rivers" races necessarily take place on skinny rivers, they are very different from collegiate meets or international championships, which generally take place on lakes where the boats line up across and start at the same time. Head races are several miles long, round corners and pass through bridges, which again is very different from a *straight* 2000 meter course. Head boats compete against each other indirectly by racing a clock. They line up in order according to numbers on the bow and start at discreet intervals — usually about 15 seconds.

Head races are sponsored in the fall, when long endurance workouts are a key part of a full-year training program geared toward the 2000 meter sprints. A Head race takes about 15 to 20+ minutes, (versus 6+ minutes for the shorter spring and summer races) providing a continuous pageant of flashing blades and team colors for supporters to encourage on.

Because the racing is quite different, luck can play a determining role. Numerous factors that can affect one's final standing in the results: the draw of the line-up, collisions, or bottleneck points. It really would be folly to place excess importance on a singular achievement, but then again, why not?
