
### Welcome to the Regatta








## Women's Rowing in the Head Of The Charles


n the fall of 1969, a young economics professor at Harvard named Gail Pierson decided to row a single scull in the Head Of The Charles. This wouldn't have been so unusual, except that no woman had ever done it before. But then again, no woman had ever asked to race. The very first year the regatta was held, in 1965, two women's fours from the Philadelphia Girls Rowing Club were invited to Boston and did compete against each other, but they never returned and no further interest was shown for women's events. Professor Pierson had just taken up sculling six months earlier, and as a member of the Cambridge Boat Club she encountered no objection to her regatta application. "Nobody said I couldn't enter," Gail remembers, "and on one made much of a fuss."

She had found herself sculling on the Charles partly to replace her first athletic love, swimming, which she found rather difficult to practice at Harvard since the men swam unencumbered by swimsuits in the main campus pool. When Gail was ushered to a tiny pool on the Radcliffe campus she was discouraged enough to search out another sport. Little did she realize that she was about to make a big splash in a much bigger

event was added to the regatta in 1970. "It has always been a policy of the Head Of The Charles race committee to create categories as the need arises," explains D'Arcy MacMahon, one of the founders of the regatta. Yet in simply responding to demand the Cambridge Boat Club sponsors of this high visibility race were the first ones to make a statement that women's rowing was just as important as men's. "And as soon as it

pool.

That year, in the novice single event that she entered, Gail rowed well enough to beat a half dozen men. While some of these competitors may have been quietly disgruntled, there was no verbal or physical effort to impede her participation in the event, unlike her running counterpart Karen Switzer, who was forcibly pushed off the Boston Marathon course during the first woman's debut. Her participation did not go unnoticed, however, by other women waiting in the wings for a chance to compete in the sport of rowing.

Responding to an obvious need for a separate women's category, the first official "women's single"

became known that there was a women's race," Gail recalls, "women started showing up to compete." Like a Pied Piper for women's rowing, Gail proceeded to win the Championship Single event for the next five years, and the women's field grew rapidly behind her.

"There was something about Gail," MacMahon reflects, "that made her the perfect sounding board for women's rowing." He recalls one Head of the Charles where she actually flipped her single off Magazine Beach, got back in, and still finished first. "A couple of fishermen backed their boat right into me," Gail remembers. "It was the strangest thing, however, because almost all of the women behind me stopped

and let me get back in my boat. Then we all finished the race." The odd incident was a clear demonstration of Gail's character, her competitors' support, and her future fate, for she would become a leader of women undaunted by a field full of obstacles.

While women had been rowing since the 1940's at local women's colleges like Radcliffe, Wellesley and Smith, it was done primarily on a recreational basis. A few private rowing clubs, most notably the Philadelphia Girls Rowing Club and the Vesper Boat Club on the East Coast, and the Lake Merritt and Long Beach Rowing Clubs in California, had been

pushing these parameters for years and trying to establish more national and international competitions for women. But they had met with considerable resistance and a lack of funding from both the National Rowing Association and colleges.

"A lack of funding is one of the reasons we didn't come up to the Head Of The Charles after that first year," recalls Tina Bayer, one of the rowers from the Philadelphia Girls Rowing Club

that raced in the first Head of the Charles. Daughter of the famous Ernestine Bayer, a PGRC founder, Tina also rowed in the first U.S. women's eight to compete internationally, in Klagenfurt, Germany, in 1967, an excursion applauded by their European rivals, but almost forbidden by the U.S. rowing officials. "He didn't think we were ready to compete," Tina recalls. "There wasn't much support."

American women didn't venture abroad again until 1972 when Gail combined with three scullers from Long Beach and a coxswain from Philadelphia to row the coxed quadruple sculls event in the European Championships in East Germany. "That was a break-

through year, "recalls Gail, "because we were clearly competitive with the Europeans, and also because while we were there it was announced that women's rowing events were to be added to the Olympics for the first time, which would be in 1976."

On the collegiate level, things started to bubble with the passing of the Title IX Act in 1972 which forced universities to disperse funds equally to men's and women's sports teams. With proper funding, women's crew programs like Radcliffe, Yale, Wisconsin, Pennsylvania and Washington all around the country were able to begin to purchase quality equipment and

entice good coaches. Prior to this time, volunteer coaches and cast-off equipment from the men's teams were the order of the day for most women's crews.

After Gail

her to come and speak to their undergraduates about competitive rowing and consult with their athletic departments about building viable racing programs. As a Harvard professor turned rowing spokeswoman, Gail Pierson soon found herself serving as a role model for young women entering the erstwhile men's sport, and reassuring them that crew was indeed an acceptable thing to do. "I can't remember how many visiting lectures I delivered on economics and how many I gave on rowing," she muses. She took the lead in establishing the first women's Olympic Rowing Committee and persuading the National

Rowing Foundation to fund women's crews.



However, making competitive women's rowing socially acceptable was as much a challenge as getting appropriate funding and physical resources. Newspaper articles in the early seventies reflected both male and female attitudes that were in need of adjustment. A 1971 article in The Harvard Crimson describes how novice Radcliffe crews, practicing on the Charles, were often heckled by men who told them it wasn't good to get muscles because "it didn't look pretty." Co-captain Charlotte Crane commented that "it took a long time for the college community and even the rowers to take themselves seriously. However,

when they did, it meant placing a greater demand on themselves and the athletic program."

Often the press themselves were a problem, focusing on the foibles and insecurities of women's rowing instead of the excitement and pleasure. A 1973 Parade article comments that the "principle complaint the girls come up with are callouses on their hands." One rower interviewed said "I

can't touch my stockings without getting a run in them."

A sports columnist named Dick Dew, writing for the now defunct Boston Evening News, thought it humorous to begin his coverage of a local woman's regatta with the following lead:

"Who says the female of the species is a lousy driver? They were all over the Charles River last Sunday and had only one collision."

And even the N.Y. Times gave its take on the "trend" of women's rowing:

"The Amazon Syndrome has been rocking the boat in women's rowing and the talk here at the national championships is about weightlifting, ergometers, running the steps of stadiums, and the flattening of the bosom."

Needless to say, it took awhile before male and female attitudes toward the sport began to change. Further along in the same N.Y. Times article, Gail Pierson addressed the issue of female strength with the message: "It's all right to be strong. It's all right to compete."



In a very short period of time, two levels of women's rowing were developing simultaneously in the U.S., collegiate competitive rowing and pre-Olympic camps which drew both post-collegiate women and those from other sports. The Women's Eastern Development Camp was established in Boston, changing its name a year later to the **Boston Rowing** Club, boating

out of Harvard's Weld Boat House. Like Philadelphia a decade previous, Boston was becoming a major center for women's rowing on both the collegiate and the international level.

By the 1970s there were no strong objections in the U.S. to women competing internationally, but there was still very little support both financially and otherwise. Gail remembers going to her first European Championships in '72 and "waiting around for hours" at the train station in East Germany until someone validated who they were for the government officials. Gail was a member of the coxed quadrascull team in '72, and the double in '73 and '74, but these boats

found themselves hard pressed by veteran squads from Russia, Romania, and Germany, all of which enjoyed a great deal more support from their respective countries. Gail's banner year was 1975 when she decided to take up sweep rowing, "where we had a chance against the Europeans." She was a member of the silver medal crew (the first woman's eight to win a medal in international competition) coached by none other than the inimitable Harry Parker. "It was sheer happiness," Gail remembers, and a validation of all the work the women had put in.

In 1972, Gail was elected president of the National Women's Rowing Association. After her experience in East Germany, she called upon the National Rowing Federation "to support the women in their international efforts." When a single sculler from Long Beach named Joan Lind won a silver medal at the 1973 European Championships, greater validation and support for international women's rowing finally began to take root and gain the respect it deserved. Gail's and other's pleas to start a separate women's Olympic Committee for rowing were heeded, and plans were laid for the first women's rowing event at the



Olympics.

Always on the leading edge of women's rowing, the Head of the Charles Committee at Cambridge Boat Club opened their doors to showcase these crews with the first women's eights event created in 1972. A Boston Globe article a year later heralded the new event by saying:

"The young ladies will definitely be in the spotlight. Reflecting increased interest in women's rowing as a result of the International Olympic committee deci sion to make women's crew an official part of the 1976 Olympics, a dozen women's 'eights' have entered the new event as part of the 'Head of the Charles'."

In 1974, Women's Championship Fours and Youth Eights were added, followed by Youth Fours in 1975, Lightweight Fours in 1978, and Club Eights in 1979. In 1980 a Women's Lightweight Eight was created, as well as several other sculling events, including Women's Club, Master, Grand Master, Lightweight, and Championship Double. By 1980, every men's event had its female counterpart, reflecting the dramatic increase in the sport a mere decade after Gail Pierson


took her first scull up the Charles.

The efforts of so many women and the men who helped them were to pay off dramatically. The first U.S. women's boat to win a medal internationally was the women's national team 8 of 1975, coached by the inimitable Harry Parker, stroked by Carie Graves who had competed at Wisconsin, now the Northeastern women's coach, and with Gail at seven seat. Joan Lind, a member of that first quad, from the Long Beach Rowing Association, won the silver medal in single sculls in the 1976 Olympics. The women's eight took the bronze. That was only the beginning. Twenty years later, our national women's crews have won many medals in international and Olympic competition. For many of the individuals who have made up those crews, the Head of the Charles was their first important race and it remains a magnet for top competitors. Joan Lind came from California in 1979 to win the Women's Singles. "I had to come," she said,

"everyone else rowed in it."

In 1976 Gail married Sy Cromwell, a World Champion Sculler and Olympic Silver Medalist and settled down to raise a family. She still resides in Cambridge, a stone's throw from the Cambridge Boat Club where she continues to row. Her daughter Abigail, now a sophomore at Princeton, carries on the family rowing tradition as a two-time winner of the Youth Singles in the Head of the Charles, and last year rowed in the victorious Youth Four for Princeton at the Regatta. In 1990, during the 25th anniversary of the Head of the Charles, Gail was honored for her contribution to the Regatta and recognized for being one of the outstanding competitors in the history of the event.

#### **Event Classifications**

Championship: Open (no restrictions).

Club: Excludes rowers who have competed in any World or Olympic championships since October 1992. Further limited to persons (including coxswains) who in any sculling or sweep-oared event ("master" or "veteran" events excepted) did not finish high enough to earn a medal ("special" medals excepted) in the preceding year's Head Of The Charles regatta, or during the current calendar year did not reach the guarter finals of the Henley Royal Regatta, or finish among the top six places in the finals of any event in any of the following regattas: any national team trials, national or international championships (e.g. Pan Ams, Lucerne-Rotsee, etc.) San Diego Crew Classic, EARC or EAWRC Sprints, Pacific Coast Rowing Championships, IRA, Canadian Henley or did not finish among the top three places in the finals of any event in any of the following regattas: Dad Vail and Champion International Intercollegitae Regatta.

**Coxswains:** May be of either sex, but must weigh at least 100 lbs, or carry weight in the boat to weigh 100 lbs. (No weigh in.)

Fours and eights: Must be sweep-oared, with coxswain.

Grand Master: At least 50 years old.

**Lightweight Crews:** Men must average below 160 lbs, no one over 170 lbs. Women must average 130 lbs. no one over 138 lbs.

**Lightweight Singles:** Men's maximum weight of 160 lbs, womens' maximum weight of 130 lbs.

Master: (singles) At least 30 years old.

Master (crews): Rowers age must average at least 40 years, no one except the coxswain under 30 years old. Men's Division: Male rowers and sculler only.

**Men's Division:** Male rowers and sculler of **Senior Master:** At least 40 years old.

Senior Veteran: At least 70 years old. Singles and doubles: Sculling, no coxswain.

Veteran: At least 60 years old

Women's Division: Female rowers and scullers only. Youth: Persons under 20 years old excluding college sophmores, including coxswain. ◆





#### Crossing the Line




Another new feature at the Finish Line is the so-called "SADL Beach Launching Area" (Singles And Doubles Launching area). In years past, all boats were launched from Magazine Beach. This year, to decrease the congestion at Magazine Beach, the SADL Beach Launching Area has been set up about 200 meters upstream from the finish line.

the competitors cross the line they must row another 50 to 100 meters upstream before they turn around and head back down the river to take their boats out of the water. It's really a great place to watch the athletes up close and personal."

To improve the viewing experience, Marc and his Co-Chair Bernice Kuca have arranged to have bleachers set up at the Finish Line for several hundred fans. There will be a "results board" to help you keep track of the competition, a PA announcing system, and several vendors will be on hand there as well. The site will be colorful and festive, and decorated with international flags. "It's going to be a unique experience," adds Marc.

Of course, Marc, Bernice and their team of 6 Finish Line volunteers have a great deal of responsibility: they must accurately track all 1,087 boats as they cross the finish line. They also have to keep boat traffic moving at the Finish Line so finishers don't interfere with next race coming up right behind them.

"After 31 years, we now have permanent finish line markers installed in the ground to designate the end of the race - easy to see, white concrete slabs with vertically protruding stakes appear on either side of the river. Our job is to sight each boat, from one stake to the other, exactly as it crosses the line," Mark explains. "It's a team effort. We have spotters located throughout the last few hundred meters of the course to coordinate with other volunteers at the launching area and the Starting Line. We are in constant radio contact." Accuracy is ensured by electronic computer timing provided by TAG Heuer, backed up by a team of volunteers taking times manually. As a safety precaution, there's a motor launch on hand with immediate access to an ambulance.



"There are 420 singles and 85 doubles entered in the race this year, and this new launching area is just for them," says Marc. "The decision to separate the singles and doubles from the teams was made for a number of reasons. Logistically, it is certainly going to simplify the launching process. It's also going to be safer for the rowers, because now the singles and doubles won't have to cross the course and land their boats in danger of colliding with the larger boats. Now, they'll have a home of their own."


There will be an enclosed area for the athletes, with a parking lot, an information tent and a rack system for 100 shells provided by the Quaise Company. A temporary floating dock has been installed, and there will be an information services booth there as well.


Finally, the new SADL Beach Launching Area will provide fans with another good spot to watch the action. "This new area will not only make launching and exiting the water as seamless as possible," concludes Marc, "it will also be a great place for viewing -the bank is nice and flat there." So, to fully experience the Head Of The Charles regatta, stop by the Finish Line to check out the launching of small boats -- and get an dynamic view of the athletes crossing the line.

line (top photo), exhausted scullers look for the finish line with twenty strokes to go.





# A Spectator's Dream

# From the Executive Director

n this Olympic year, it is appropriate to put America's Fall Rowing Festival into perspective and to thank the many people and organizations that make the Head Of The Charle regatta such a world-class event. But first, a few observations.

# The Ultimate Rowers' Race is now the Ultimate Spectators' race too.

Last summer in Atlanta, I watched the rowing competition from the grandstands with some 25,000 others -- and I truly enjoyed the fine athletic competition and all the grandeur of the Olympics. Like the Olympics,

the Head is truly an international event, with over 420 scullers and 650 crews from home and abroad. However, I couldn't help but notice how much different the Head Of The Charles is -- from both the rower's -- and the spectator's -- points of view.

First of all, the Head Of The Charles is a much longer race: three miles of twists, turns and seven bridges versus the 2,000-meter Olympic course. We also have many more boats and rowers on the water -- we expect 1,087 shells and over 4,500 athletes to compete this year! Here, instead of 25,000 spectators concentrated at the finish line, we have as many as 300,000 fans cheering the action from start to finish. I think this gets to the heart of why so many Olympians want to do this race: the Head Of The Charles regatta is the ultimate rower's race.


We attract the sport's greatest athletes because this event offers more competition, more excitement, more action -- and more fans -- in the biggest one-day rowing spectacle on earth.

in 1996 at: www.BayBank.com -- and after the race, the HOCR will go on-line using the domain name of www.hocr.org. Please visit both sites, soon.


