



THE UNLIKELY DUO

n rowing there is widely held belief that partners in a successful two person boat must adhere to two rules. One is that they must be friends who can understand each other and genuinely enjoy each other's company. Secondly, they must be physically compatible, generally the same height, weight, strength, and similar in both training program and stroke. Jim Dietz and Larry Klecatsky, two of the most successful scullers in Head Of The

be farther apart in the second.

Together Klecatsky and
Dietz have won over 30 Head
Of The Charles titles in the
three decades since they started
rowing out of the same
boathouse at the New York
Athletic Club. While each rower
has succeeded in his respective
individual events over the
years, it was in the double scull
where the unlikely duo stamped
their mark on the Head Of The
Charles regatta.

Standing just under 6'6", Jim Dietz is the perfect picture of a heavyweight sculler. The Bronx, NY native won his first HOCR title in the Championship Single in 1966 and went on to win six consecutive titles between 1971 and 1976. Larry Klecatsky, at a touch over 5'9" and weighing 145 pounds on a

full stomach, was in many ways the counterbalance to Dietz. Klecatsky won his first HOCR Lightweight Singles title in 1967 and then won nine straight from 1970-1978. At the same time each sculler was racking up an impressive individual race resume during the 1970s, the two were also setting the standard for speed in the Championship Double event, which they won from 1971-1975.

"You know Larry's so competitive, he'd race a stick down the river," says Dietz fondly of his friend and partner. Unprompted and in a separate conversation Klectasky says of Dietz, "It was always great to row with him, I can't remember when the last occasion was but he's an extremely aggressive, competitive guy." They are different size peas in a long wooden pod.

How did it happen that two such physically mismatched rowers ended up rowing with each other in the first place? Dietz explains: "Jack Sulger, our coach,

threw us together first for the the nationals in 1971 or so. I remember getting to the line and Larry saying to me as we looked across at the other six boats, 'Well, you can beat all the big guys here and I can beat the little guys here, so it's going to be *nolo contende*.' And it was. We just flew."

Adds Klectasky, "In those days, we were rowing multiple events at the other regattas. I'd row all lightweights and he'd row all the heavyweights, and Sulger put us together in the double and we won that too. After that at any regatta we went to we rowed the heavyweight double together . . . so that became our routine in those days."

And what about the size difference, something that could put the brakes on a double? "He had a very short reach for a big guy, " says Klecatsky. "And I had an extraordinarily long reach so it worked out well."


"We tricked the rigging, I think I was out at 160cm and he was at 158cm, I was rowing with 3 meter blades at the time and he was with 298's," remembers Dietz. "We always just worked the angles. He's a very long sculler to begin with, and we always just complemented each other."

Klectasky, who is the Director of the Department of Emergency Medicine at Soundshore Medical Center in

New Rochelle, NY, says another big difference between the two, especially during head racing season, was their approach to training.

"I don't think he ever trained as much as I did, certainly not later on in his career, to maximize his results," says Klectasky. "He was a competitor, not a trainer."

Dietz agrees with his friends assessment. "I just remember Larry being like a cheerleader [at the Head]. Maybe he was always just in better shape than I was, but there would be this little voice sitting on my shoulder talking to me the whole way down the course 'Okay, relax, get longer, all right let's move now.' He was just constantly talking and I was completely amazed that he could talk because I could barely breathe."

Klecatsky continues, "I can remember always the first half of the Head Of The Charles, saying 'Jim take it easy, just go easy.' And in the last half having to kind of beat him and say 'You're the greatest, come on let's go.' He was the typical champion sort of guy. On race day he was at his best, and the more crowd there was the better for him, so as the Head Of The Charles got more spectators, it just brought more competitive blood into his system."

When asked if any individual race on the Charles stands out, Dietz says each year was an adventure in its own way, as both he and Klecatsky had to arrange their race day sched-

ules to fit in their individual events as well as the double. "He always went first in the light single, and then we'd be back in the hotel room at the HoJo's resting up before we went out for the double. And then we'd get the double done and row back to throw me in the single, because the single was always the second to last event."

"They're all pretty memorable," recalls Klecatsky of the years when he and Dietz were both winners at the Head Of The Charles. "That was an event that, although it was supposed to be after the season, we always got pretty enthused about. We never really

practiced in the double, we pretty much just raced. He was going to school at Northeastern so he knew the river. I would meet him up there and we'd go out in the darkseemed like in the middle of the night always Saturday night, and race the regatta on Sunday morn-

Today, Dietz, who is the Head Women's Crew Coach at the University of Massachusetts-Amherst, says racing in the Head is more an exercise in getting fit and surviving the race. "Now, going to the Head of the Charles and rowing in the masters single, I used to

> look forward to that so much, and now it's like, God, why couldn't I have been a sweep oarsman and have eight guys I could hop in with, and you don't have to be in shape you can just go out and do it. This time of year, come August I try to shed the pounds and get in shape because I know I have to do that three miles in Boston. It's hell. It's like you can't wait for it to be over."

> For Klecatsky, however, who has won the Grand Masters Single title since 1991 and holds the course record in the event, going to Boston every October is a chance to get the competitive juices flowing again. "Doc", as Dietz calls Klecatsky, still rows every day and only when he turned 50 did he stop racing in elite lightweight events.

> The records that Dietz and Klectasky hold are cemented in the books and will never be broken as rowers can no longer



BOSTON'S ATHLETES WELCOME THE WORLD

ften the subject of scenic watercolors, Boston's boathouses are familiar icons to both rowers and non-rowers alike. But these classic structures belie their oft-captured serenity come Regatta weekend. Set against the dramatic autumn landscape these buildings buzz with activity from the start of the first event mid-day on Saturday to the conclusion of the Championship Eights race on Sunday afternoon.

Over the last thirty-two years, the athletes from these boathouses, colleges and clubs, have contributed to the growth the Head Of The Charles regatta. Today, the Head has is recognized both nationally and internationally as the "global granddaddy" of fall head races - more than 70 fall "head" races staged across America have been modeled after the Head Of The Charles.

To make the Head Of The Charles a hospitable

sporting event, each local institution with a home site on the Charles rolls out the red carpet. Every fall the coaches, athletic directors, students and athletes from local clubs open their doors to foreign and out-of-town crews as well as provide invaluable physical and material support to the regatta.

Unfortunately, due to over-subscription, not all of Boston's rowers are able to race on regatta weekend. Instead, many then volunteer at sites up and down the banks of the river. For instance, the novice men and women from Tufts University Crew control parking at Magazine Beach, the site of dozens of boat trailers and hundreds of specialized racing shells. "Working for the Regatta, becoming part of the race day 'machinery' gives our novice men and women an important introduction to the rowing world." says Tufts Head Coach Garv Caldwell.

Rowers from Boston College and Community Rowing also contribute at Magazine Beach in the early morning and late evening, tackling the muddy and wet job of setting up and breaking down the slippery black jet-float docks used by their fellow competitors. Kudos to the hard-working volunteers who complete especially labor-intensive chore with a bright outlook and a keen sense of humor!

The soon-to-be rebuilt Boston University boathouse, located at the start of the three mile race, teems with rowers, race officials and alumni on race weekend. Even with this potentially confusing activity, Rodney Pratt and Holly Hatton, our hosts at Boston

University, ensure that the race officials have the space and support to start a fair race for all.

EVENT SPECIFICATIONS

(AGES AT MOST RECENT BIRTHDAY AS OF REGATTA SUNDAY)

Club: Limited to persons (including coxswains) who in any sculling or sweep-oared event ("master" or "veteran" events excepted) did not compete since 1993 in any World championships or Olympic games, or did not finish high enough to earn a medal ("special" medals excepted) in the 1995 Head Of The Charles Regatta, or did not during the current calendar year reach the quarter finals of the Henley Royal regatta, finish among the top six places in any national team trials, national or international championships (e.g. Pan Ams, Lucerne-Rotsee, etc.), the San Diego Crew Classic, EARC or EAWRC Sprints, Pacific Coast Rowing Championships, I.R.A., or Canadian Henley Regattas, or finish among the top three places in the Dad Vail or Champion Internationational Intercollegiate Regattas.

Senior Veteran: At least 70 years old. Veteran: At least 60 years old. Grand Master: At least 50 years old. Senior Master: At least 40 years old. Master (singles): At least 30 years old. Master (crew): Rowers' ages average at least 40 years. no one except coxswain under 30 years old.

Youth: Persons (coxswains included) under 20 years old. who are not yet in their sophmore year of college.

Lightweight (crew):

Men: Average of rowers's weights not to exceed 160 lbs, no one over 170 lbs.

Women: Average of rowers' weights not to exceed 130 lbas, no one over 138 lbs.

Lightweight (singles): Maximum weights: men: 160 lbs., Women: 130 lbs.

Championship: Open (unrestricted).

Men's divisions: Male rowers and scullers only. Women's divisions: Female rowers and scullers only. Coxswains: May be of either sex, but must carry sufficient weight on them in the boat to weight at least 100lbs during the entire race (no weigh-in).

Fours and Eights: Sweep-oared, with coxswain. Singles and Doubles: Sculling, no coxswain.

Mowatt Cup: Presented to the winner of the Men's Grand Master

Singles in memory of H.H. "Mo" Mowatt, long time friend of the Head Of The Charles.

Coleman Cup: Presented to the winner of the Men's Lightweight Fours in memory of Charles Coleman, inspiring lightweight rower at St. paul's and Yale and early supporter of the Head Of The Charles.

City of Cambridge Cup: Presented to the winner of the Women's Lightweight Fours by the Mayor of the City of Cambridge.

Boston Herald Cup: Presented to the winner of the Men's Lightweight Eights by the publisher of the Boston Herald.

Boston Cup: Presented to the winner of the Women's Lightweight Eights by the Mayor of the City of Boston.

Arlett Cup: Presented to the winner of the Men's Lightweight Singles in honor of George Ernest Arlett, key advisor to the founders of the Head Of The Charles.

Singer Cup: Presented to the winner of the Women's Lightweight Singles in honor of Edward Singer, the starting line "voice" of the Head Of The Charles for its first 20 years.

Cromwell Trophy: Presented to the winner of the Men's Championship Double in memory of Seymour Cromwell, national and international sculling champion and member of the Cambridge Boat Club.





IN MEMORIUM

his spring rowing lost one of its pioneers. Ernest Arlett, the proper English gentleman, whose rowing accomplishments spanned two continents and several decades passed away at the age of 84.

Thirty-three years ago Arlett had a question. Why were there no "Head" style races in America? He,

along with others from Cambridge Boat Club, proposed that a "head of the river" race, similar to races held in his native England, be held on the Charles. The excitement and great racing we experience today is his legacy to Boston and the international rowing community.

Arlett, known to the rowing world as "Ernie," also had a hand in another great Boston rowing tradition...the Northeastern University rowing program. He was the founder and first varsity coach of the fledgling crew from Huntington avenue.

Ernie was born in Henley on Thames, England, site of the world famous Henley Royal Regatta and cradle of much of the world's rowing talent. As a young man, Arlett rowed as a professional sculler racing for cash prizes in various regattas around England. Ernie also supervised the Leander Boat Club on the Thames from 1930-1939.

At the outset of WW II, Ernie enlisted with the Oxford and Bucks Light Infantry and Royal Engineers. As a sergeant he served with distinction in France, Belgium, India and Burma.

After the war he returned to the river Thames to continue his coaching career. He began his career as a coach for the National Provincial Bank Rowing Club from 1948 to 1957. During that time, he also coached Finland's 1948 Olympic Team and American Olympic sculler John B. Kelly, Jr.

In 1959 Ernie immigrated to America. After a brief stint at Rutgers University and Harvard, he was hired to be the first coach of rowing for Northeastern. In 1965 Arlett took his precocious Husky crews, 3 days on the bus, to the Dad Vail Regatta in Philadelphia, PA. These scrappy "men in black" took the American rowing scene by storm. Wearing their distinctive black

tanktops, the freshman, junior varsity and varsity swept the regatta and were crowned small college champions.

I was a member of the varsity crew that year. We had spent a difficult year rowing in borrowed boats out of Riverside Boat Club. Making the trip to Philadelphia to race against established teams was

our opportunity to test the hard work we had done all year.


Watching the freshman and junior varsity pull up to the awards dock to receive their gold medals inspired us to charge toward the finish line. Ernie advised us to "row within ourselves, stay calm, MAKE IT HURT and we'd do just fine." We were victorious in a hard fought race over Temple and Marietta winning, in the final strokes, by 2 feet. Ernie and his wife Edith were elated. My father's camera captured Ernie standing there in his trademark tweed jacket and tie giving the victory "V" with his right hand.

The camera malfunctioned producing a double exposure of our winning boat superimposed between the "V," a fitting picture for the triumph.

These victories catapulted Northeastern into Division I rowing competition. Arlett led his varsity crews to Eastern Sprints Championships in 1972 and 1973. Both times the Huskies traveled to Ernie's hometown, Henley-on-Thames, to row in the Henley Royal Regatta.

Ernie coached Northeastern for 14 years, retiring in 1977. The aging pictures on the walls of the Northeastern boathouse document Ernie's past accomplishments. But his legacy continues today. Both the men and women of Northeastern continue to be among the nation's best. The little "head" style regatta he helped launch in 1965 has become the world's largest. Ernie was a formidable competitor, excellent coach and friend of rowing. He will be sadly missed and fondly remembered.

Roger Borggaard graduated Northeastern University in 1968, is a member of the Northeastern Rowing Hall of Fame, and is still an active participant of the Regatta's Race Committee.







HEART AND SOUL

to

s the fifty-five member 1997 Race Committee met for the final time last Tuesday night, I told myself, "this year is going to be incredible!" We had met every week for the past two months, and like proud architects adroitly checking off a hundred last-minute issues before the unveiling of this historic weekend, we had officially been granted a green light to begin racing.

Enthusiasm had peaked - understandably - because this group has been through hell and high water preparing to host the 1997 edition and because of the stature that this race has earned in the world of rowing. Now, finally, the weekend is here - the 33rd Head Of The Charles regatta.

A crew working in concert like a well-oiled machine, slicing through the water with athletic precision, competitive fires roaring, is arguably as much an art form as one can find in any gallery. To be a sculler in the race, muscles burning and lungs ready to explode as the finish line approaches, can be a life-defining event. Sound hyperbolic? Just ask any of the nearly 5,600 rowers here this weekend and listen to the passion of their words.

A recent article from a British newspaper that focused on the Zen of rowing really struck a chord with me. Rowing, said the author, is unlike any other sport. It's similar to meditation in that the goal is not simply to win, it's to reach a higher plane of understanding, to come as close to perfection on the water as possible; it's an eloquent way to describe a sport that takes so much more than mere muscle.

There are no time-outs in rowing, no water breaks or coaches with chalk in hand who will devise a new strategy if the race plan isn't quite working. On race day, the brutal physical and mental burden is solely on the athletes, and this is the beauty of rowing.

The first thirty strokes of the Head Of The Charles takes most shells through the railroad bridge just above the starting line. This is called the "free minute" because there is no significant withdrawal from the fitness bank. As they pass Magazine Beach, hearing encouragement from classmates and friends, rowers pump their fresh legs in unison with aggressive ease and the adrenaline flows nicely. But after a few more strokes they reach the Riverside Boat Club and their engines begin to burn fuel in earnest; five minutes have passed, and sweat drips from each brow, occasionally blinding the rowers' vision.

It is time to pour it on in the Powerhouse Stretch, and the scullers and coxswains know that this is where to make a move because it is the longest, straightest section on the three mile course. This four to five minutes of the race course is critical for building rhythm and speed because turning under bridges there are seven on the race course - slows boats dramatically. The Powerhouse, however, is also when the Grim Reaper begins to show his ugly head.

Scullers and crews pass under four bridges as they approach Weeks Footbridge at the midpoint of the course where the difficult task of negotiating the complex reverse turns at Weeks and Anderson bridges looms ahead. Lactic acid levels rise sharply, increasing pain to new peaks, now the fitness bank pays out large sums of aerobic credits as the rowers push hard

keep their shells moving at an even pace.

The huge, appreciative audience at Weld Boathouse helps dull the mounting pain in the rowers' legs and arms; with about twelve minutes gone and five to eight minutes more to go, the mind begins to play tricks with body. The little voice is whispering in the rowers' ear, "Why did I choose rowing?" The rowers press on with limbs of lead. There is no escape, only the

prospect of the finish line.

to get through this challenge. Oxygen is scarce, the fitness bank is nearly empty, and the race is not done. The little voice whispers again, "Who picked this distance for Head races?"

There is light at the end of the tunnel once clear of the infamous Eliot Bridge, whose massive stone abutments reach out and grasp unaware crews. The sprint is nearly on

twenty strokes past the Belmont Hill Boathouse dock but oxygen overdraft notices have been arriving for several minutes already. There are two minutes left. Is it possible?

Every aerobic penny has been spent. The debt is incalculable and there are still fifty strokes left to be paid. The body screams for rest but the rowers' pride and training somehow enable them to continue, the will is stronger. Stroke ratings are forced up with the last surge of effort - last twenty.

Bodies slump in unison across the line, cries of relief and deep gasps are heard as the rowers seek litres of fresh air and slowly their senses return to normal. Another Head Of The Charles rowed to the point of total exhaustion.

Remembering rough waters

We know we have a huge responsibility and a wonderful privilege on our hands as the 33rd Head Of The Charles regatta begins. To me, this event is the "heart and soul" of rowing.

Thousands of competitors, coaches, spectators, organizers and sponsors converge to make this, the largest regatta in the world, something truly spectacular.

Missing out

on the event last year due to the weather makes this year's event all the more wondrous to me.

A few final words about the unfortunate storm that interrupted our plans last year: I'd like to thank everyone for being so understanding of our decision not to put scullers and crews in danger. Many traveled long distances and at great expense to be here, especially the competitors from foreign lands, and we greatly

lete safety and allow more buffer time on the course between races. We also gained the ability to admit more competitors without adding any new events. We accepted over 1,000 additional rowers this year, for a total of more than 5,600 athletes competing over two days.

We've come a long way since that first race in 1965 when just 100 shells graced the Charles River. This



appreciate their understanding.

In one sense our canceling the Regatta was an easy decision to make because there is no way we would risk life and limb over athletic pride and joy. As much as it pained us to miss out on the event we so love, we took the only prudent course of action. It makes the 1997 race even more rewarding.

Two "Heads" are better than one

This year we are breaking 32-year tradition by starting the racing on Saturday afternoon and finishing up on Sunday. This new format will increase athyear, competitors from 18 different nations will vie for the coveted designation of "Head Of The Charles" which will be bestowed on them on Saturday or Sunday evening. The world's best will be on hand, including many of this year's current World Champions who raced in early September in France. But they will have to prove they are the best again, for there are no prizes given here for past achievements.

precious hours to help orchestrate this weekend. These folks have worked all year to execute this increasingly complicated event. They've done an outstanding job.




As you go about your way


