TEAM USA ENTRY FOR THE ATLANTIC ROWING RACE 2001

Most every rower who has competed in the Head Of The Charles® will tell you that it's a long and grueling race rowed on a course that's difficult to navigate.

Compared to most rowing races it is. But compared to next year's Atlantic Rowing Race 2001, it's a piece of cake. While the Head Of The Charles is a 3 mile race rowed on a protected inland river, the Atlantic Rowing Race, will be raced across 3,000 of open ocean.

Team USA, the sole American entry in the Atlantic Rowing Race consists of Tom Mailhot, 40, from Essex, MA, and John Ziegler, 50, from River Edge NJ. They will race against 49 other entries in identical boats. The Race will start next October at Tenerife in the Canary Islands off the West African Coast, and will end some 50-60 days later at the Caribbean Island of Barbados. The teams in the Atlantic Rowing Race 2001 will be rowing in identical boats that are built from laser cut kits provided by the Race organizer, Sir Chay Blyth. Each boat is assembled by the team, or by their designated builder. The Team USA boat, which is still unnamed, was built at Essex Shipbuilding Museum by Tom and John

The specially design boats are 23'-5" long, have a 6'-4" beam, and weigh 1,650 pounds when fully loaded. They are equipped with two rowing stations, a cabin for sleeping and protection, as well as, a solar powered desalinator, emergency gear, communication and navigation equipment, supplies and food for the long crossing. To complete the crossing in their goal of 55 days, they will need to row approximately 55 miles every 24 hours. Their plan is to alternate rowing with eating and resting ever two hours around the clock. In order to meet their goal, they will consume a daily diet of 8000 calories per person. They will carry enough food and supplies for 100 days at sea.

Tom Mailhot and John Ziegler and their Team USA boat will be at the Head Of The Charles Rowing and Fitness Expo at Magazine Beach on Friday and Saturday. They will also row over the course and have their boat on display above the finish line on Sunday. As you watch the men's and women's championship scullers row by, several of whom competed in this year's Olympic Games, you may wonder what it takes to excel in a single scull. Many assume that a world-class scullerlike American Ruth Davidon is the crme de la crme of a country's rowing program, the soloist who best exemplifies the highest level of the rowing art.

An outstanding sculler, however, is often the scrapper, the underdog who was passed over for a position in a national team boat and had to fight her way, alone, to the top seed. Names like Davidon, who rowed in the Women's double scull in Sydney, should be uttered not only with due reverence for their current high standing in the rowing world, but for the way they single-handedly climbed the ladder to success-with good old-fashioned will power.

It was not that long ago that Davidon, originally an aspirating National Team sweep rower, was dismissed by former U.S. coach Kris Korzeniowski as "too small" to make it into the eight. Several years and many muscles later, she emerged as the top sculler in the country. Perseverance pays off in the single. This weekend she will go up against the Australian stand-out, Georgina Douglas, who narrowly won the championship single last year, as well as her Olympic doubles partner, Carol Skricki.

When Don Smith won the men's championship single last year over local favorite Cyrus Beasley, and then went on to win an exciting dual against Aquil Abdulla at the U.S. singles' trials, it left many people with the same question on their lips: who is this

guy? Both in terms of his physical stature (6' 7") and his well-hidden sculling talent, he has taken many by surprise. Yet Smith, a native of Buffalo, New York, has been rowing since age fifteen, and has been a member of several U.S. sweep teams, including medal winning performances in the eight at the 1993 and 1995 World Championships.

A Syracuse University graduate, Don took a few years off in 1997 and 1998 to complete a graduate degree in finance here at M.I.T. But apparently finance wasn't the only thing he was studying. While crunching numbers by day, Smith was also sculling up and down the Charles River in his spare time, quietly learning how to make the numbers come down in a single.

Good scullers are not only blessed with perseverance, but are wily as well. As many discover, it is often hard to maintain the high level of training required to do well internationally without the benefit of being part of a crew. Because of this, many scullers return to their sweep rowing roots for a time in order to charge their batteries. Former world champion Jamie Koven, who opted to row in the U.S. Olympic four this year, and Cyrus Beasley, (who was offered a position as a spare, but declined) will also be a part of the men's field this year. Aquil Abdulla, who narrowly lost at the U.S. trials, will also be on hand to try and unseat Don Smith.

But who knows what new face may come out of the pack this year, someone who has been putting in the solitary miles and keeping his or her speed a well-kept secret.

TWENTY YEARS AFTER THE BOYCOTT

When Soviet tanks rolled into Afghanistan on Christmas Day in 1979, we didn't think much of it. We were athletes holed up in boathouses and weight rooms across the country, training for the 1980 Olympic Games. What possible connection could there be between our efforts and the actions of the Red Army? President Jimmy Carter provided the answer to that question in January of 1980, when he declared that the United States would not participate in the Moscow Games unless the Soviets withdrew from Afghanistan by May 15. We continued our training and the selection process in a kind of daze. Would the Soviets withdraw? Would the athletes' suit against the United States Olympic Committee prevail? Could we compete as individuals and not for the United States? Would the Peanut Man relent?

The Soviets of course did not withdraw, the USOC bowed to the pressure of the State Department, and the State Department threatened to revoke our passports if we tried to compete individually. The rowing teams were selected and we competed in pre-Olympic regattas in Lucerne, Amsterdam, and Henley, winning a bunch of medals and putting the rowing world on notice about the strength of our crews. But when the rest of the rowing world went on to Moscow, we went home.

The 1980 boycott was a failure. The Soviets did not withdraw from Afghanistan until 1989. The 1980 Games were cheapened by our absence, and the 1984 Games in Los Angeles in turn were tainted when most of the Soviet bloc countries refused to attend, citing bogus concerns for their athletes' safety. An entire generation of American athletes was alienated by their government's policy. Many of the rowers on the 1980 Team continued to compete after 1980, and some even went on to Los Angeles. But for most, we could not afford to postpone career and family matters for another four years, and we retired from international com-

petition. When athletes marching in the opening ceremonies of the Olympic Games are interviewed and declare that it is the proudest moment of their lives, as they did most recently in Sydney, most of the athletes from 1980 can only imagine what they mean. That happens with every Olympics, and for many, the passage of time only makes it more poignant.

At this year's Head Of The Charles Regatta, the men and women of the 1980 Olympic Rowing Team will gather in Boston to celebrate their 20th reunion. The most positive aspect of the 1980 boycott is that it forged stronger bonds among this team than perhaps any other. On their tenth anniversary in 1990, the men's eight traveled to Moscow to meet and race their Soviet counterparts on the Olympic course. In 1991, the Soviet and U.S. eights rowed together in Miami at a FISA veterans regatta. In each October for the past

20 years, men and women from the team have competed at the Head as the "1980 Rowing Club." And perhaps more than any other team, the men and women from 1980 have given back to their sport in remarkable ways. The 1980 Team includes coaches of national teams and prominent university programs; manufacturers of the highest quality racing shells, oars and

ergometers; members of the National Rowing Foundation, the Men's and Women's Olympic Rowing Committees, and the United States Olympic Committee; founders and directors of the CRASH-B Sprints and Boston's Community Rowing; a past chairperson of the Head Of The Charles; and perhaps most notable of all, a current senior member of the International Olympic Committee, whose career was born out of her vocal and articulate opposition to the 1980 boycott.

As athletes we are proud of our association with the 1980 Team, and we are grateful that the Head has served as the common thread for our annual reunions on now 21 occasions. For any of us, we will row in the Head only as the 1980 Rowing Club, until we can't pull an oar any longer.

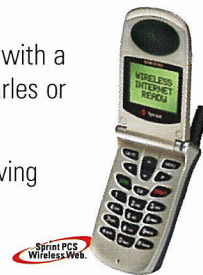

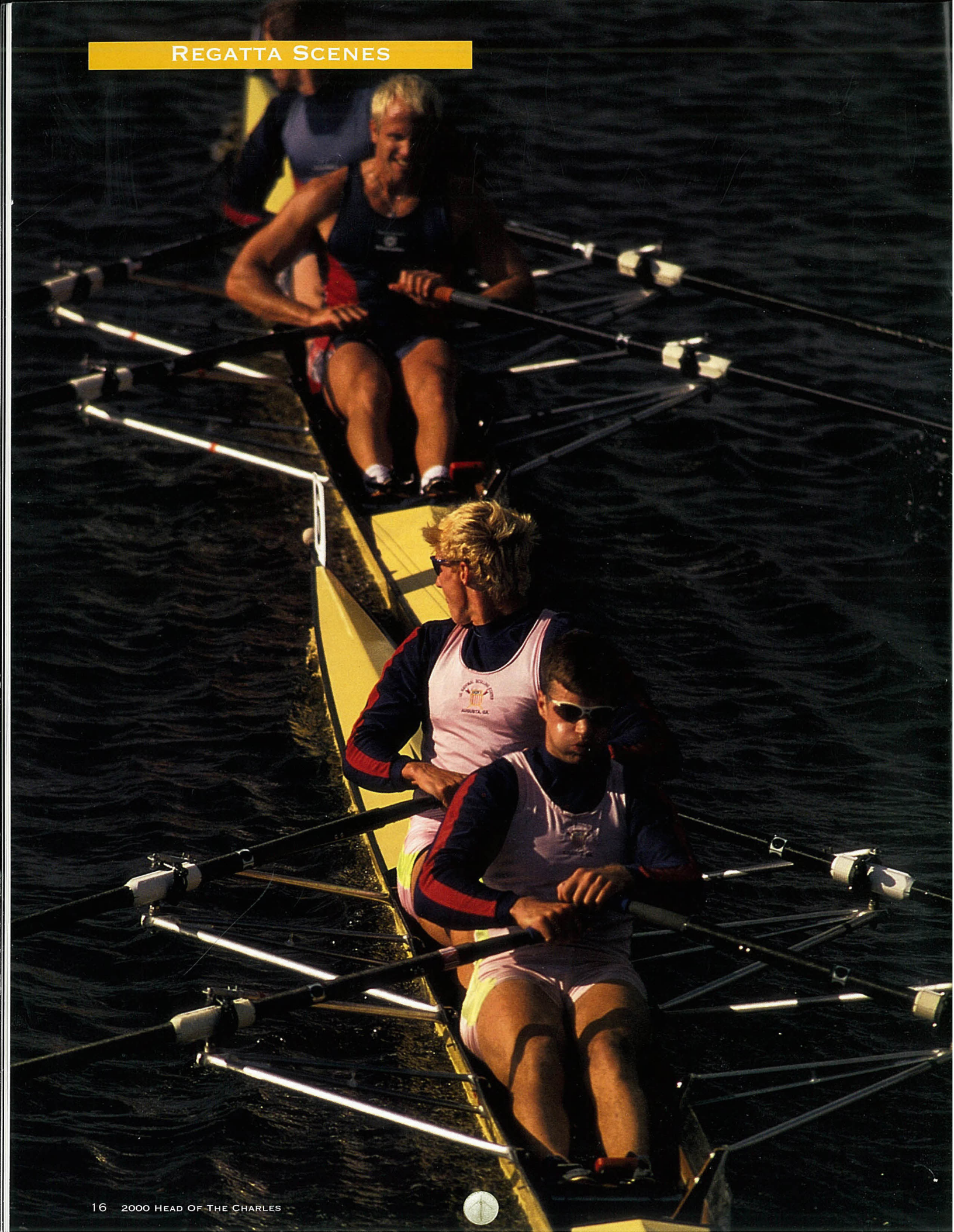

Master (singles): At least 30 years old.

Master (crew): Rowers' ages average at least 40 years, no one except coxswain under 30 years old.

Master 50+: Rowers' ages average at least 50 years, no one except coxswain under 30 years old.

Youth: Persons (coxswain included) under 20 years old and not yet in their sophomore (2nd) year of college/university.

High School: A crew composed entirely of students under 19 years old from a single High School.

Lightweight (singles): Maximum weights: Men: 160 lbs. Women: 130 lbs.

Lightweight (crew): Men: Average of rowers' weights not to exceed 160 lbs., no one over 170 lbs.

Women: Average of rowers' weights not to exceed 130 lbs., no one over 138 lbs.

Championship: Open (unrestricted).

Men's divisions: Male rowers and scullers only.

Women's divisions: Female rowers and scullers only.

Coxswains: May be of either sex, but must carry sufficient weight on them in the boat to weigh at least 100 lbs. during entire race (no weigh-in).

Fours and Eights: Sweep-oared, with coxswain.

Singles and Doubles: Sculling, no coxswain.

Peggy Hawes Cup: Presented to the winner of the Women's Club Singles in honor of Margaret E. M. Hawes, inspiring founder of the Cambridge Boat Club's children's rowing program.

Olrich Bowl: Presented to the winner of the Men's Veteran Singles in memory of Jerome Olrich, twelve-time Head Of The Charles winner and key participant in the Regatta's development.

Wade Trophy: Presented to the highest placing Men's Senior Veteran in memory of Leonard "Zeus" Wade, key contributor to early Head Of The Charles regattas and long-time Senior Veteran standout.

Witte Trophy: Presented to the highest placing Women's Senior Veteran singles in memory of Edward and Eleanor Witte, beloved senior rowing members of the Cambridge Boat Club.

MDC Cup: Presented to the most competitive (percent behind the winner) Massachusetts high school crew by the Commissioner of the Metropolitan District Commission.

Mowatt Cup: Presented to the winner of the Men's Grand Master Singles in memory of H.H. "Mo" Mowatt, long time friend of the Head Of The Charles.

Coleman Cup: Presented to the winner of the Men's Lightweight Fours in memory of Charles Coleman, inspiring lightweight rower at St. Paul's and Yale and early supporter of the Head Of The Charles.

City of Cambridge Cup: Presented to the winner of the Women's Lightweight Fours by the Mayor of the City of Cambridge.

Boston Herald Cup: Presented to the winner of the Men's Lightweight Eights by the publisher of the Boston Herald.

Boston Cup: Presented to the winner of the Women's Lightweight Eights by the Mayor of the City of Boston.

Arlett Cup: Presented to the winner of the Men's Lightweight Singles in honor of George Ernest Arlett, key advisor to the founders of the Head Of The Charles.

Singer Cup: Presented to the winner of the Women's Lightweight Singles in honor of Edward Singer, the starting line "voice" of the Head Of The Charles for its first 20 years.

Cromwell Trophy: Presented to the winner of the Men's Championship Double in memory of Seymour Cromwell, national and international sculling champion and member of the Cambridge Boat Club.

Swayze Cup: Presented to the winner of the Women's Championship Doubles in honor of Craig Swayze, former president of the St. Catharines Rowing Club and key promoter of Canadian participation in the Head Of The Charles.

Schaefer Cup: Presented annually to the winner of the Men's Championship Fours.

Barnes Plate: Presented to the winner of the Women's Championship Fours in memory of Hope Barnes, former captain of the US Women's Olympic Rowing Team and two-time winner of the Head Of The Charles.

Curtis Trophy: Presented to the winner of the Men's Championship Singles in memory of the Hon. Lawrence Curtis, inspiring Cambridge Boat Club sculler, war hero, and US Congressman.

Cambridge Boat Club Plate: Presented to the winner of the Women's Championship Singles by the Board of Directors of the Cambridge Boat Club.

Boston Globe Trophy: Presented to the winner of the Men's Championship Eights by the publisher of the Boston Globe.

Governor's Cup: Presented to the winner of the Women's Championship Eights by the Governor of Massachusetts.

Sportsmanship Award: Presented (when earned) to crews and single scullers who demonstrate exemplary sportsmanship.

D'Arcy MacMahon Crew Point Trophy: Presented annually to the institution whose crews compile the highest aggregate point total.

1st Place Medals: Awarded to the winning single sculler or members of the winning crew in both the men's and women's divisions of each event.

Subsidiary Medals: Awarded to runner-up single scullers or members of the runner-ups in both the men's and women's division of each event. The number of medals awarded in each division is determined by the number of entrants in each division. A subsidiary medal is awarded per every 10 entrants.

Special medals: Awarded to the most competitive (% behind winner) male and female Youth sculler in the regatta, the fastest crew composed entirely of students under 19 years old from a single High School in each division of Events 6 and 8, and the fastest master crew averaging at least 50 years old in each division of Events 9, 10 and 12. Paul Revere Point Trophy
Presented annually to the institution whose crews compile the highest aggregate point total based on the following formula for each crew (not affected by single scullers): $100/[1 + 50(c/w-1)]$ where c = the crew's time and w = the winner's time.

If such were the case then how do we explain events such as the Head Of The Charles that succeed every year depending almost exclusively on volunteer power?

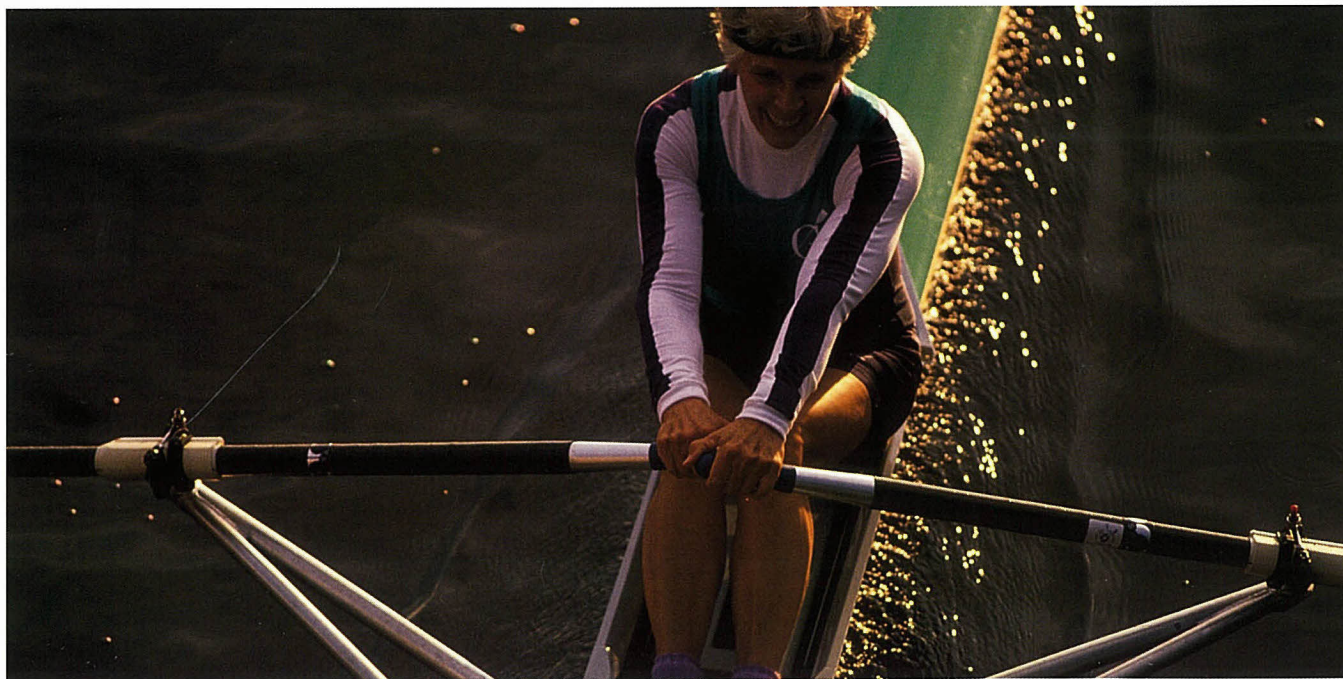

What is truly remarkable is that all of this has been done almost exclusively on the backs of volunteers, legions of them. For thirty-five years! Conclusion? Volunteerism is alive and well in Boston!

What does it take to put on this regatta each year? The answer is very simple. Nine hundred volunteers! And who are these nine hundred volunteers? In the non-coated section in this program you will find a list of them. They comprise a Board of Directors and an Executive Committee that meet year round to plan and fine-tune the regatta. They comprise a Race Committee that consists of the co-chairs of 35 subcommittees, 70 plus people who meet weekly and who work on the regatta from late summer through the fall. They comprise 35 subcommittees such as Hospitality, Computer Timing, Manual Timing, Announcing, Wireless Communication, Judges, Launches, Registration, Results each in its own way critical to the success of the regatta.

So if you enjoyed the weekend, whether as a spectator or as a competitor, whether this is your 36th regatta or your first, whether you are from Cambridge, MA or Cambridge, England consider thanking a volunteer. Better yet, thank 900 of them!
