Rowing is a sport for everyone and its popularity is on the rise. But it is still not quite as popular as football. The fall, however, is an important season for both sports. Across the nation, playing fields ring with the sounds of drills, well-placed blocks, and the shouts of coaches. The sounds of rowing are subtler; they include the hushed tones of shells slicing through the water, breathing, and the turn of the oars as rowers prepare to take another stroke. It is rare, but not unheard of, for rowing to gain converts from the "big ticket" sports like football. John McCarthy decided to give rowing a try after years of playing and coaching football. His morning workouts now include navigating bridges instead of dodging rushing defensive linemen. The rush of rowing the last quarter mile of the Head OfThe Charles® Regatta is much

like the challenge of a 4th Quarter 3rd and long play—the odds are against you, the pressure on and the push for the line is the only thing that matters.

While commuting to his graduate classes at Boston University, John dutifully watched the scullers plying the Charles. Marrying a former U.S. National Team rower was further evidence of his interest in the sport. His introduction to rowing came when Boston University rowing coach Rodney Pratt invited John to give sculling a try. John's athletic pedigree and 6'3" 210-lb. frame is matched by his determination and disciplined approach to both the mental and physical aspects of training. In 2000, he tested his fitness and new interest in rowing by competing at the U.S. Olympic Trials in Camden, NI.

John's "dual citizenship" serves him well in his dealings on the football field. As an Academic Coach with Boston's Madison Park High School football team, he uses his experience with the harmony and balance of rowing when working with the players through the National Football League's Play It Smart Program. He also blends his experience with rowing and football to consult groups of coaches, professional athletes, and corporations on performance enhancement.

John will be rowing in the Championship Double Scull this weekend. So, as you watch him and the other rowers today, know that some of the competitors began rowing in high school or college and some are new to the sport...including those that traded rushing for rowing.

Traditionally, the Head Of The Charles® is considered a social gathering as much as it is a world-class rowing event. Crowds wind their way down the river between Cambridge and Boston as a parade of boats rows by. Last year, with the support of Charles Schwab, the Regatta launched the Charles Schwab Sprint Challenge so that Boston's dedicated fans could see the world's top scullers race head-to-head.

In 2000, the Head Of The Charles® and Charles Schwab joined forces to provide a purse of \$30,000 for the winners of the Schwab Sprint Challenge. The Sprints are a side-by-side dash between the three top head racers for the undisputed title of the "head" of the Charles. Through Charles Schwab's generosity, the Head Of The Charles® is now able to attract the world's premier international scullers.

The scullers begin by racing from Boston University's DeWolfe Boathouse and snake their way down three miles of river navigating seven bridges to finish in front of Artesani Park. The rowers leave the starting line in a staggered fashion; while there are occasional changes in position, it is difficult for observers to determine who's in the lead. The Regatta's computerized timing system and on-site results distribution provide Regatta spectators with real-time results.

The new format invites the top three finishers to line up head-to-head. These three finishers from the head race move on to Sunday's quarter-mile Charles Schwab Sprint Challenge. With \$7500 motivating these proven scullers for overall supremacy, you can bet they will give full measure. The Sprint begins just downstream of the Western Avenue Bridge and ends just downstream

the "Powerhouse Stretch" not only for the electrical power plant on its banks, but also in recognition of the grueling workouts performed by locals in that area. The high stone walls and ample viewing locations provide an outstanding venue for spectators.

Last year the Sprint racers included Olympic champion Rob Waddell from New Zealand, who defeated Olympic silver medallist Xeno Muller of Switzerland. Third place went to Don Smith, the U.S. Olympic sculler. The women's event also featured an Olympic rematch; Ekaterina Karsten of Belarus and Rumyana

of the Weeks Footbridge. This portion of the river is known as

Neykova of Bulgaria won gold and silver, respectively, in Sydney.

Their rematch was overshadowed by underdog New Zealander

Sonia Waddell. It was a good day for the Waddells as Sonia prevailed over the quarter-mile course to take the title in an upset.

The post-Olympic year is often a time when new challengers make their mark on the international rowing scene. This year will be no different. Norway's Olaf Tufte, winner of the World Rowing Championships in Lucerne, Switzerland will travel to Boston to challenge 1996 Olympic champion Xeno Muller. Germany's 2000 Olympic bronze medallist Marcel Hacker and

Australia's Duncan Free, who won the Henley Royal Regatta Diamond Sculls this summer, will also be vying for the title. Medford, MA native Steve Tucker will have Boston's rowing community in his court.

On the women's side, Julia Levina from Russia is coming off a silver medal performance in this year's World Rowing Championships.

Two-time Olympic champion Ekaterina Karsten will be back and hungry to avenge her loss last October. Poland's single sculler Agnieszka Tomczak had a strong showing at Worlds and is looking to make her mark at the Regatta to confirm her place as one of






the world's best. Carol Skricki just missed last year's Charles Schwab Sprint Challenge after finishing fourth in the head race. If she qualifies this year, she has the ability and strength to dash for cash.


The Head Of The Charles® was originally organized by a group of Cambridge Boat Club scullers to determine local bragging rights.

Now in it 37th year, Schwab has provided the resources that allow the Regatta Committee to innovate and enhance the race for the benefit of spectators and competitors.



Why are so many people gathered at the Eliot Bridge? You can listen to the announcer on the PA, of course. But ask any veteran Regatta watcher and there's only one real answer: It's where the best crashes take place; it's where a coxswain's mettle is acid-tested.

Let's face it. Despite our cordiality, our college degrees, and our veneer of civility, when we climb into boats or gather along the banks to watch them, there's not that much separating us from the crowd at the Indy 500 or at the cockfights. The Head Of The Charles® is famous for crashes. And if the competitors cooperate today, you'll see some good ones.

We've all got our favorites. In my mind's eye I can see the men's championship eights one year when three top varsities converged on the center arch at the same time. Most of the time there's a

violent confrontation, blades whacking each other, the unforgiving sound of carbon fiber smacking brick or concrete. But this time, the boats locked oars so efficiently that no one could move. The boats drifted in dream slow motion into the bridge. A soft thump was all that could be heard above the roar of the crowd.

Veteran Eliot watchers remember with awe the men's championship four from 1992. A very strong crew (whose identity will be protected) was really motoring through the pack. With less than a half mile to go, there was little doubt that they were on their way to victory.

The coxswain was having trouble holding the buoy line on the port side. Perhaps her coxbox was malfunctioning or maybe her crew was so fired up that port refused to ease off. At any event,

she rejected the idea of trying to shoot through the right-hand arch, perhaps having been warned about the difficulty of negotiating such an acute angle. As the four got closer and closer, it appeared that most of her effort was directed at willing the bow to move to port.

They hit the abutment head on, crushing the bow and trapping the poor coxswain's legs in the carbon fiber. That's right, she was in a bow-coxed four. Somehow the crew managed to get the shell to shore, where a plastic version of the Jaws of Life was used to cut her out of the craft.

The story ends happily. She was taken to Beth Israel and released a few hours later. She stayed away from the Boathouse for seventeen months and would never agree to cox a front-loader







again. But she finished her career as an excellent cox, albeit one who was always very nervous about bridges.

In any discussion of bad days at the Eliot Bridge, one coach and one day will immediately surface. No coach has ever had an afternoon in Cambridge like Charlie Hamilton did in 1971. In 1970 Charlie's boys crew at Mount Hermon School had blazed up the river on their way to a victory for junior crews, winning the prestigious Princeton trophy. Our story takes place the next fall when Hamilton returned to the Charles with high hopes for his young crews.

"My singles event was immediately before the youth eights," recalls Hamilton. "I had rowed one of my best races, really knocked myself out, so on the paddle back to Cambridge Boat

Club (right at the Eliot turn) I felt totally fogged out. As I stopped under the bridge and prepared to cross over to Cambridge, I heard this tremendous roar from the crowd, the kind of noise you only hear when there is blood in the water and the sharks are out—in short, when there is a collision at the bridge. [Author's note: In those days there was no restriction on alcohol consumption along the banks of the river and the roars could often be measured on the Richter scale.] As I began to turn my boat, I heard Al Shealy's mother raise her foghorn voice above the crowd and cry 'Chuck, they hit the bridge. Your boys hit the bridge.'

"I looked up and saw that sure enough our first boat had hit the bow oar on the abutment, breaking the oarlock and knocking the oar completely out of the rigger. It was floating right under the bridge. Through the arch, I could see the crew limping toward the finish line with only seven people rowing. I thought that I'd better pull the oar out of the water, so that other boats wouldn't hit it.

"I started under the bridge, but you can imagine how easy it is to pick up a sweep oar in a scull while eights are beginning to come through. I figured I'd better get out of there and leave the oar. So, I pulled under the Cambridge side arch, which in those days was closed to racing crews, and waited. Our second boat came around the turn, right on the buoy line like they should be. But I watched them leave the buoys too early, and I realized that they were going to hit the bridge just a few feet away from me. "The crowd was roaring again, and I was shouting, but the



coxswain was leaning on the port rudder and they missed the bridge but hit the oar floating in the water. It got stuck under the boat somehow, and they dragged it a bit, and had to stop to get it out. Understand that probably ten other boats had gone through without hitting the oar, but we hit it. Well, right on the second boat's heels came our third boat, having the row of their lives, looking great. [Author's note: In those early days of the Regatta, it was possible to have multiple entries. Some events did not even fill—a far cry from today.] They were following the buoys exactly the way the second boat had, the coxswain was making a carbon copy of the previous course. They, too, began to leave the buoys early and came right at the abutment.


"It was at that moment that I decided that I must've broken something in my brain during my race. I must have been imagining this. It couldn't be happening. I watched in a trance as the coxswain made a desperate attempt to correct his course. The bowman went through the bridge; I thought maybe it would be OK, but then a split second later I saw his feet sticking up in the air. The boat was pinned against the arch, the bowman knocked onto his shoulders. I was feet away from the coxswain, shouting 'Is he all right?' 'The coxswain just kept yelling, 'It's not my fault! It's not my fault!'

"Somehow they got going again and I looked up to see our last crew, the fourth boat. They were coming so slowly that I figured even if they hit the bridge they'd bounce right off, but wouldn't you know it, a perfect course."

The score: Eliot Bridge 3, Northfield Mount Hermon 1. Has any coach ever had a day like this?

"The very next year, we had another good crew and our first boat hit the bridge again. That really started the jokes. People asked if I wanted a target painted on the bridge. Luckily, in 1973 we steered clear and won the event. After five or six years people forgot about our disasters. Now, I probably get more pleasure than most people when I hear the announcer at Cambridge say that NMH is steering a perfect course through the bridge."

The Head Of The Charles® is rowing's once-a-year opportunity to bask in the spotlight of a bona fide audience. Every October thousands of rowing enthusiasts line up along the banks of the Charles alongside many Boston residents who, despite living among the sights of shells gliding along the glassy orange water at sunrise, know almost nothing about the sport itself. The Head Of The Charles® is the time when Bostonians stake their undeniable claim to the sport of rowing.

They come to see the best in the sport propel their fragile crafts, and occasionally crash them, on the waters that wind through the city. The participants are fit. They are big (for the most part). They are tough. And increasingly, they are women. Rowing is the fifth fastest growing collegiate sport for women,

according to a study done by the General Accounting Office last year. But take a look at all the different classes of boats, and you'll find that more and more high school girls are taking up rowing.

Even career women and stay-at-home moms are trading in spinning classes for early morning crew practices.

Collegiate women's rowing is on the rise due largely to the enforcement of legislation that has become known simply as "Title IX." Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972 is the landmark legislation that bans sex discrimination in schools, whether in academics or athletics. While this legislation has been on the books since 1972, it was not enforced for nearly 20 years. Throughout the 1970s, various bills were introduced trying to limit Title IX's role in intercollegiate athletics.



Enforcement of the bill began in earnest in 1992 when the Supreme Court ruled that plaintiffs in Title IX lawsuits are entitled to punitive damages when intentional action to avoid Title IX compliance is established. This pushed the NCAA into action. In that same year, the NCAA published a landmark Gender-Equity study of its member institutions. Not surprisingly, an overwhelming majority of schools were not in compliance.

Women's rowing has become the overwhelming choice of many colleges to bring them into compliance based on the numbers of athletes a crew team supports. "With rowing, you can have close to 55 women, between varsity and novice teams," explains Rutgers University women's coach Max Borghard. "It's a quick way for a lot of schools to get in balance with equity."


The NCAA began sponsoring the sport in 1994. By 1998, women's crew had the fourth-highest increase in participation among all NCAA sports, adding 3,750 more student/athletes between 1995 and 1997. Indeed, U.S. Rowing records indicate a steady rise from just 74 schools in the NCAA in 1994 to 136 this season.

But it's not just the college scene that's seeing a rise in women's rowing; high schools are experiencing marked increases in the levels of girls joining their crew programs. Ashton Richards, who has coached high school girls for 18 years at four different schools, thinks the sport's appeal to high school girls is intrinsic. "I think that girls are coming to the sport in droves due to the implicit and aesthetic qualities of rowing: close relationships, a lack of superstars, hard work, discipline, and commitment to others."

These values seem to be appealing to their moms as well. As parents head to the river each weekend to watch their kids, they are starting to catch the rowing bug themselves. Eric Rothstein, coach at a Washington, D.C. area high school, has seen an explosion of growth in the master's program he coaches due to parents trying out their kid's sport. "Our adult program began with eight people two years ago and we'll be at over 50 this summer. Almost all of these are people who were introduced to the sport when their kids rowed in high school."

Indeed, master's women are one of the fastest growing segments of the rowing community. Caroline McLeod, a master's rower at Washington, D.C.'s Capital Rowing Club, says rowing's appeal to older women may be due in part to the low-impact motion.


The camaraderie that develops through morning rows is another attractor for women. "When you get up that early to work out together, there's a bond that you just don't experience in other sports," says McLeod, who gets dreamy when she talks about the transcendental benefits of early morning rows. "When you are on the river, it feels like you're in the wilderness even in an urban area, and it's a time of day that's breathtaking; you can really get outside of yourself." Still, the early hour is a turn off to many

would-be rowers. "It's the early morning practices that separate the enthusiastic from the crazed," jokes McLeod.


Whatever the motivation to pick up an oar, whether it's early morning solitude, a break from the monotony of gym machines, or a relentless competitive drive, women are carving their niche in a traditionally male sport. Their presence is an inspiration to many and an undeniable force for the future. You go girl!

# P25 EVENT SPECIFICATIONS

**CLUB:** Limited to persons (including coxswains) who in ANY sculling or sweep-oared event ("Master" or "Veteran" events excepted) DID NOT:

**A.** Earn any Senior World Championship or Olympic gold/silver/bronze medal or a 1st place medal in any Championship (open) event of the Head Of The Charles® Regatta.

B. Compete in any Senior World Championships or Olympic Games since 1995.

C. Earn a medal ("Special Medals" excepted) in the 2000 Head Of The Charles® Regatta.

SENIOR VETERAN: At least 70 years old.

VETERAN: At least 60 years old.

GRAND MASTER: At least 50 years old.

SENIOR MASTER: At least 40 years old.

MASTER (SINGLES): At least 30 years old.

**MASTER (CREW):** Rowers' ages average at least 40 years, no one except coxswain under 30 years old.

**MASTER 50+:** Rowers' ages average at least 50 years, no one except coxswain under 30 years old.

**YOUTH:** Persons (coxswain included) under 20 years old and not yet in their sophomore (2nd) year of college/university.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** A crew composed entirely of students under 19 years old from a single High School.

D. In 2001, reach the quarterfinals of the Henley Royal or Henley Women's Regattas, OR finish among the top six places in any national team trials, national or international championships (e.g., FISA World Cup, USRowing National Championships ("Elite" only), Pan American Games, Lucerne, FISA Junior Worlds, FISA World Championships, Head Of The River, London, etc.), San Diego CC, EARC or EAWRC Sprints, PCRC, NCAA, PAC-10, IRA, or Canadian Henley ("Junior" events excepted), OR finish among the top three places in the Dad Vail or Avaya Communication Collegiate Championship. The Race Committee reserves the right to rule on whether foreign entries are appropriately seeded within the CLUB event.

LIGHTWEIGHT (SINGLES): MAXIMUM WEIGHTS:

Men: 160 lbs. Women: 130 lbs.

LIGHTWEIGHT (CREW):

MEN: Average of rowers' weights not to exceed 160 lbs., no one over 170 lbs.

WOMEN: Average of rowers' weights not to exceed 130 lbs., no one over 138 lbs.

**CHAMPIONSHIP:** Open (unrestricted).

MEN'S DIVISIONS: Male rowers and scullers only.

WOMEN'S DIVISIONS: Female rowers and scullers only.

**COXSWAINS:** May be of either sex, but must carry sufficient weight on them in the boat to weigh at least 100 lbs. during entire race (no weigh-in).

FOURS AND EIGHTS: Sweep-oared, with coxswain.

SINGLES AND DOUBLES: Sculling, no coxswain.

**BOSTON HERALD CUP:** Presented to the winner of the Men's Lightweight Eights by the publisher of the *Boston Herald*.

**BOSTON CUP:** Presented to the winner of the Women's Lightweight Eights by the Mayor of the City of Boston.

**ARLETT CUP:** Presented to the winner of the Men's Lightweight Singles in honor of George Ernest Arlett, key advisor to the founders of the Head Of The Charles.

**SINGER CUP:** Presented to the winner of the Women's Lightweight Singles in honor of Edward Singer, the starting line "voice" of the Head Of The Charles for its first 20 years.

**CROMWELL TROPHY:** Presented to the winner of the Men's Championship Double in memory of Seymour Cromwell, national and international sculling champion and member of the Cambridge Boat Club.

**SWAYZE CUP:** Presented to the winner of the Women's Championship Doubles in honor of Craig Swayze, former president of the St. Catharines Rowing Club and key promoter of Canadian participation in the Head Of The Charles.

**SCHAEFER CUP:** Presented annually to the winner of the Men's Championship Fours.

**BARNES PLATE:** Presented to the winner of the Women's Championship Fours in memory of Hope Barnes, former captain of the US Women's Olympic Rowing Team and two-time winner of the Head OfThe Charles.

**CURTIS TROPHY:** Presented to the winner of the Men's Championship Singles in memory of the Hon. Lawrence Curtis, inspiring Cambridge Boat Club sculler, war hero, and US Congressman.

**CAMBRIDGE BOAT CLUB PLATE:** Presented to the winner of the Women's Championship Singles by the Board of Directors of the Cambridge Boat Club.

**BOSTON GLOBE TROPHY:** Presented to the winner of the Men's Championship Eights by the publisher of the *Boston Globe*.

**GOVERNOR'S CUP:** Presented to the winner of the Women's Championship Eights by the Governor of Massachusetts.

**SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD:** Presented (when earned) to crews and single scullers who demonstrate exemplary sportsmanship.

**D'ARCY MACMAHON CREW POINT TROPHY:** Presented annually to the institution whose crews compile the highest aggregate point total.

**1ST PLACE MEDALS:** Awarded to the winning single sculler or members of the winning crew in both the men's and women's divisions of each event.

**SUBSIDIARY MEDALS:** Awarded to runner-up single scullers or members of the runner-ups in both the men's and women's division of each event. The number of medals awarded in each division is determined by the number of entrants in each division. A subsidiary medal is awarded per every 10 entrants.

**SPECIAL MEDALS:** Awarded to the most competitive (% behind winner) male and female Youth sculler in the Regatta, the fastest crew composed entirely of students under 19 years old from a single High School in each division of Events 9 and 11, and the fastest master crew averaging at least 50 years old in each division of Events 4, 12, and 14. Special medals will not be awarded to winners of regular medals.

**PAUL REVERE POINT TROPHY:** Presented annually to the institution whose crews compile the highest aggregate point total based on the following formula for each crew (not affected by single scullers): 100/[1 + 50(c/w-1)] where c= the crew's time and w= the winner's time.

**CROSBY AWARD:** Presented annually to the Grand Veteran (at least 75 years old) posting the most competitive (ratio to winner's) time, in memory of Thomas Crosby's endearing contribution to the traditions of Grand Veteran sculling at the Head Of The Charles Regatta.

**DUNCAN CUP:** Presented annually to the winner of Men's Youth Fours, in recognition of Roger and Mary Duncan's outstanding contributions to schoolboy rowing in New England and to the inspiration they gave to early developers of the Head OfThe Charles Regatta.

**MCINTYRE CUP:** Presented annually to the winner of Men's Club Eights, in memory of Howard McIntyre, MD, cofounder and early leader of the Head Of The Charles Regatta.

**PIERSON CUP:** Presented annually to the winner of Women's Club Eights, in recognition of Gail Pierson Cromwell's years of service to the Cambridge Boat Club and her pioneering work in the development of women's rowing in America.

**TALBOT CUP:** Presented annually to the winner of Men's Master Fours, in memory of Samuel S. Talbot's tireless work on behalf of the Head Of The Charles Regatta, his omnipresent sense of humor, and his contribution to Master rowing at the Cambridge Boat Club.




